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DISCLAIMER

Data presented in this document are representative of the individuals transiting at the flow monitoring points during the timeframe indicated. Data should not be generalised and do not represent a full picture of inter and intra-regional migration, but rather of migration flows at the specific locations monitored. For example, while IOM aims to establish flow monitoring points at locations with high transit flows (based on information from informed stakeholders), flows are fluid and specific locations will provide an incomplete picture. The monitoring of flows in an assessed location should not lead to assumptions about flows in a non-assessed location or area without monitoring points.

Migrants adjust their routes according to opportunities and obstacles they encounter along their journey. Their intended transit and destination locations are often subject to change. This renders the systematic assessment of their mobility throughout the region complex.

Flow Monitoring is one of the four components of IOM's Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM), a system that tracks and monitors displacement and population mobility. Flow Monitoring generally relies on two tools, (i) Flow Monitoring Registry (FMR), which observes migration flows and produces quantitative, observational data based on groups arriving or departing together and (ii) Flow Monitoring Survey (FMS) which produces qualitative data on intentions and profiles of individuals.

Both exercises are conducted at Flow Monitoring Points (FMPs), which are often major transport hubs or key border crossings points of high mobility, identified through extensive consultation with key informants. These key informants are often government officials, local community leaders, and humanitarian partners who have widespread knowledge about population mobility in their respective locations.

Flow Monitoring Survey data was collected once

a week from 1 November 2020 to 31 January 2021 by trained enumerators and supervised by designated field staff. It is important to note that this methodology allows for regular information on trends along or within a specific network of points that track a particular migratory route. However, the restricted geographic coverage, time constraint and self-reported nature of responses all constitute limitations to the methodology, which does not provide representative data but rather an indication of trends.

The findings in this report are reflective of data collected from 1 November 2020 to 31 January 2021. During this period, a total of 43,099 movements were observed through FMR, and 2,329 migrants were approached to take part in the FMS. However, of those approached, 4 had already participated and 1 individual did not consent to being interviewed, bringing the sample size to 2,324 respondents. Children below the age of 14 years old were not asked to participate in the survey.



Number of migrants surveyed




Figure 1: Number of migrants surveyed at each Flow Monitoring Point.


Figure 2 shows the number of migrants surveyed each week across the five FMPs throughout the reporting period. Note that changes in the number of surveyed migrants do not necessarily reflect broader migration trends. The number of migrants surveyed were lower overall during the months of November and December 2020. This is possibly due to movement restrictions that have

been in place in response to containing COVID-19. However, a high number of surveys were answered during the first and third weeks of January 2021. Note that there is a positive correlation between the number of flows captured through the Flow Monitoring Registry tool and the number of surveys answered through the Flow Monitoring Survey tool.






Sex of Migrants




Sex and Age of Migrants




Top 5 Reported Marital Statuses of Migrants











Top 5 Most Reported Highest Levels of Education of Migrants




The most common level of education reportedly obtained by respondents was primary education (40.8%). The second most reported education level was lower secondary education (23.6%). 21.2% of respondents reported receiving less than primary education.

Main Profession/Occupation of Migrants Prior to Departure




Of the 853 migrants who reported their main occupation prior to departure, a majority are skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (282 individuals or 33.1%).

Country of Departure






704 migrants intended to travel from Ethiopia to Saudi Arabia.

A large majority of migrants reported leaving from Ethiopia (1,476 migrants or 63.5%), while 704 migrants intended to travel from Ethiopia to Saudi Arabia.

The second largest group consisted of 374 migrants (16.1%) who left Sudan, and the third largest country of departure was Yemen with 150 migrants (6.5%).

Top 10 Countries of Intended Final Destination*




Reasons for the Journey**



78.8% (1,831 migrants) cited economic reasons as the main reason for embarking on their journey

The majority of movements were driven/motivated by economic reasons (78.8% or 1,831 migrants), followed by marriage, family reunification or family formation (16% or 372 migrants).

Reasons for movement by Route**



Economic reasons was the main motivator for undertaking journeys across all routes. This is particularly the case for migrants traveling along the Eastern, Northern and Southern routes where 100% of migrants cited economic reasons as the main motivator for travel. Of the total migrants tracked on the Horn of Africa Route, 2% cited economic reasons,

as well as family reunification (0.8%). This round of FMS migrants solely reported economic reasons and family reunification as reasons for traveling. The Horn of Africa route, which was the most popular route in the previous round of FMS, saw a 98.5% drop in movements this round. This is most likely due to COVID-19 travel restrictions and border closures.



3. INTENTIONS

Top 10 Reasons for Choosing Destination Country**



When asked about the reason behind the choice of their destination country, a total of 1,680 migrants (52%) mentioned job opportunities as the main reason. 642 migrants (19.9%) cited that they were returning to their home countries. In addition, 266 migrants (8.2%) reported following their friends or family along the journey. Another 200 migrants (6.2%) mentioned family/ relatives in the desired destination country, and 179 migrants (5.5%) were traveling to create a business or return to a business.


Intended Final Destinations By Specific Reasons



Plan to Return Home





Percentage of migrants who did not know if they planned to return home in the next 12 months.




Percentage of migrants who reported that they plan to return in the next 12 months.





Top 10 Main Difficulties Faced by Migrants**




