

## Summary

Askira/Uba (Triggers: fear of attack, voluntary relocation): 225 new arrivals and 83 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba during the reporting period. These include 68 individuals (INDs) who arrived at Lassa from Kopa/Multhafu ward of Askira/Uba, 59 INDs who returned to Uba from Cameroon, 70 INDs who returned from Adamawa, 28 INDs who returned from Biu, 34 INDs who left for Madagali in Adamawa, 42 INDs who left for Michika, and 7 INDs who left for Jalingo in Taraba.

Bama (Triggers: voluntary relocation, military operation): 20 INDs arrived at Bama during the reporting period. These include 13 arrivals at Banki Camp from Cameroon and 7 arrivals at General Hospital Camp from Soye ward of Bama (5 INDs) and Pulka IDP Camp in Gwoza (2 INDs).

Chibok (Trigger: improved security): 18 INDs left Chibok for Kwamdi ward of Damboa LGA.

Damboa (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 15 INDs arrived at Ajari ward of Damboa from Gorabja and Kafa/Mafi wards of Damboa LGA.

Dikwa (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 10 INDs arrived at Dikwa during the reporting period. These include 6 INDs who arrived at 20-Housing Estate and 4 INDs who arrived at NRC Transit Camp.

Gubio (Trigger: Attack): 5 INDs arrived at Bula Karave village from Kayowa, Ngamma ward of Magumeri LGA.

Gwoza (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 465 INDs arrived at Gwoza during the reporting period. These include 92 INDs who arrived at Pulka/Bokko from neighbouring wards, 134 INDs who returned to Gwoza town from Adamawa, 66 INDs who returned from Balegaltimari ward of Jere LGA. 21 INDs who arrived from Bama LGA and 10 INDs who arrived from Kirawa in

Kaga (Trigger: poor living conditions): 34 INDs arrived at NRC Camp in Benisheikh from Maonok ward of Kaga.

Kukawa (Trigger: improved security): 28 INDs arrived at Kukawa town during the reporting period. These include 19 INDs who arrived from Maiduguri M.C. and 9 INDs who arrived from

Maiduguri M.C. (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 18 INDs arrived at Bakassi Camp from General Hospital Camp Bama.

Madagali (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 209 INDs arrived at Madagali town during the reporting period. These include 97 INDs who arrived at the town from surrounding wards, 71 INDs who arrived from Cameroon, 30 INDs who arrived from Askira/Uba and 11 INDs who arrived from Mubi-South LGA in Adamawa.

Mafa (Triggers: improved security, voluntary relocation): 19 INDs arrived at Mafa Camp A (10 INDs) and Mafa Camp B (9 INDs) from Dusuman ward of Jere LGA.

Michika (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 72 INDs arrived at Michika and 35 INDs left Michika during the reporting period. These include 42 INDs who arrived at the town from Askira/Uba. 14 INDs who arrived from Zah ward of Michika. 11 INDs who arrived form Numan ward. 5 INDs who arrived from Madagali LGA. 18 INDs who left for Gwoza town and 17 INDs who left for Mubi-North.

Monguno (Trigger: poor living conditions): 147 INDs arrived at Monguno during the reporting period. These include 127 arrivals at Water Board Camp from Guzamala LGA, 10 arrivals at Fulatari Camp and 10 arrivals at Stadium Camp from Kukawa LGA.

Mubi-North (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 10 INDs arrived at Kolere village from Kwaja ward of Mubi-South LGA.

Mubi-South (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 18 INDs arrived at Mubi-South and 46 INDs left Mubi-South during the reporting period. These include 11 INDs who arrived from Madagali, 7 INDs who arrived from Girei, 27 INDs who left for Gwoza, 14 INDs who left for Maiha and 5 INDs who left for Yola-North LGA.

Ngala (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 115 INDs arrived at International School Camp-Ngala during the reporting period. These include 65 INDs who arrived at the Camp from surrounding villages, 35 INDs who arrived from Cameroon and 15 INDs who arrived from Ikoyi in Lagos.
