

Summary

Askira/Uba (Triggers: attack, voluntary relocation): 111 new arrivals and 34 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba during the reporting period. These include 74 individuals (INDs) who arrived at the town from surrounding villages due to recent attacks in the area, 19 INDs who arrived from Cameroon, 12 INDs who arrived from Hong Local Government Area (LGA) of Adamawa State, 6 INDs who arrived from Gombi in Adamawa and 34 INDs who left Multhafu for Madagali LGA in Adamawa.

Bama (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 118 INDs arrived at Bama and 18 INDs left Bama during the reporting period. These include 108 INDs who arrived at Banki from Kolofata in Cameroon, 10 INDs who arrived from Zalar village in Bama and 18 INDs who left General Hospital Camp for Pulka in Gwoza.

Chibok (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 4 INDs left Kuburumbula in Chibok for Kwamdi in Gumsuri ward of Damboa LGA.

Damboa (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 11 INDs returned to Ajari community in Damboa from Maisandari ward of Maiduguri M.C.

Dikwa (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 39 INDs arrived at Dikwa during the reporting period. These include 23 arrivals at FOB arrival centre, 9 arrivals at Bulabulin IDP Camp and 7 arrivals at 20-Housing Unit Camp.

Gubio (Trigger: attack): 12 INDs arrived at Guzari/Bulakaraye community in Gubio, from Magumeri LGA, due to recent attacks in Magumeri.

Gwoza (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 523 INDs arrived at Gwoza and 23 INDs left during the reporting period. These include 75 arrivals at Pulka Transit Camp, 27 arrivals at GSS Camp, 7 arrivals at the New Transit Camp, 308 arrivals at Gadamayo community, 58 arrivals at Bulabulin, 48 arrivals at Pulka and 23 INDs left Gwoza town for Pulka.

Jere (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 17 INDs arrived at Muna Dalti in Dusuman ward of Jere, from neighbouring Muna Kumburi village and 83 INDs left Muna Dalti for Mafa Camp A.

Kala/Balge (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 48 INDs arrived at Rann in Kala/Balge during the reporting period. These include 27 arrivals from Cameroon and 21 INDs who arrived at Rann town from Kalma Kumaga ward of Kala/Balge, due to poor living conditions in the area.

Kaga (Trigger: poor living conditions): 17 INDs arrived at NRC Camp in Benisheikh from Konduga LGA.

Konduga (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 8 INDs arrived at Boarding Primary School Camp Konduga and 1 IND left the Camp for Mandarari community in Kaleri ward of Konduga.

Kukawa (Triggers: improved security, poor living conditions): 61 INDs arrived at Kukawa and 5 INDs left Kukawa during the reporting period. These include 13 INDs who arrived at Kukawa town from Jere, 19 INDs who arrived at the town from Kushi in Alagarno ward of Kukawa, 12 INDs who arrived from Sokoto State, 7 INDs who arrived from Jigawa State, 10 INDs who arrived from Konduga LGA and 5 INDs who left Kukawa for Gaya LGA in Kano State.

Madagali (Triggers: attack, poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 127 INDs arrived at Madagali and 22 INDs left Madagali during the reporting period. These include 40 INDs who arrived from Cameroon, 30 INDs who arrived from Kopa/Multhafu in Askira/Uba, 17 INDs who arrived from Madagali LGA in Adamawa, 15 INDs who arrived from Zing in Taraba, 14 INDs who arrived from Damboa, 11 INDs who arrived from Gombi in Adamawa and 22 INDs who left Madagali for Kurnabasa village in Gwoza.

Mafa (Trigger: poor living conditions): 212 INDs arrived at Mafa Camp A and Camp B during the reporting period. These include 132 arrivals from Jere, 69 arrivals from surrounding wards in Mafa and 11 arrivals from Dikwa LGA.

Maiduguri M.C. (Trigger: attack): 5 INDs arrived at Bakassi Camp in Maisandari ward of Maiduguri M.C., from Ganjia in Nганzai LGA, due to an attack in Ganjia.

Michika (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 54 INDs arrived at Michika and 22 INDs left during the reporting period. These include 32 INDs who arrived from Cameroon, 15 INDs who arrived from Numan (8 INDs) and Song (7 INDs) LGAs, 7 INDs who arrived from Dalla in Kano State, 17 INDs who left for Mubi North LGA and 5 INDs who left for Yola North LGA.

Monguno (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 37 INDs arrived at Monguno during the reporting period. These include 16 arrivals at Water Board Camp, 14 arrivals at GSSS Camp and 7 arrivals at Stadium Camp.

Mubi-North (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 11 INDs arrived at Digil ward of Mubi-North from Wakane ward in Gwoza.

Mubi-South (Triggers: attack, poor living conditions): 12 INDs arrived at Mubi-South during the reporting period. These include 7 INDs who arrived at Lamurde ward from Maiha LGA and 5 INDs who arrived at Nasarawo ward from Cameroon.

Ngala (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 72 INDs arrived at International School Camp Ngala during the reporting period. These include 26 arrivals from Cameroon, 33 arrivals from Ankaras in Kala/Balge, 7 arrivals from Soye ward in Bama and 6 arrivals from Ngalori ward of Marte LGA.
