

INTRODUCTION

This snapshot summarizes available data on Ethiopian nationals from IOM's Migrant Presence Monitoring (MPM) Round 2. Data collection took place between May and July 2022. ¹The MPM baseline assessment is designed to systematically assess, through a series of MPM Rounds, neighborhoods (admin level 4) in Lebanon to quantify the presence of migrants and support operational assistance, coordination, and planning. Data collection is based on estimations received from Key Informants who are mostly composed of migrant community representatives, Mukhtars - local authorities of these areas, and Municipality officials. A first round of data collection took place between October 2020 and June 2021.²

DISTRIBUTION OF ETHIOPIAN NATIONALS PER CADASTER IN LEBANON


During Round 2 of the MPM, 50,432 Ethiopian nationals were identified in 882 (55%) cadasters out of 1,610 across all 26 districts. Compared to Round 1 of the MPM, there was a general decrease of Ethiopian nationals in the country and, in particular, from 25,452 to 7,814 individuals in Beirut governorate, but there was an increase from 14,669 to 26,092 individuals reported in Mount Lebanon governorate.

The majority of Ethiopian nationals were reported in El Meten (17%), followed by Beirut (16%), Baabda (11%), Kesrwane (10%) and Aley (9%) districts. A total of eight districts had between three to six per cent of Ethiopian nationals each, namely Jbeil, Chouf, El Nabatieh, Baalbek, Saida, Sour, Aley and Kesrwane.

Within El Meten district, Nabaa (8%) and Mtayleb (6%) were the main areas with presence of Ethiopians, while in Beirut district, those were the neighbourhoods Qoreitem (19%), Bachoura (8%), and Raouche (6%).



In total, an estimated 50,432 Ethiopian nationals were identified in Lebanon.
