

INTRODUCTION

This snapshot summarizes available data on Sudanese nationals in Lebanon from IOM's Migrant Presence Monitoring (MPM) Round 2. Data collection took place between May and July 2022.¹ The MPM baseline assessment is designed to systematically assess, through a series of MPM Rounds, neighborhoods (admin level 4) in Lebanon to quantify the presence of migrants and support operational assistance, coordination, and planning. Data collection is based on estimations received from Key Informants who are mostly composed of migrant community representatives, Mukhtars - local authorities of these areas, and Municipality officials. A first round of data collection took place between October 2020 and June 2021.²

DISTRIBUTION OF SUDANESE NATIONALS PER CADASTRE IN LEBANON


During Round 2 of the MPM, 11,539 Sudanese nationals were identified in 197 (12%) out of 1,610 cadasters across all 26 districts. Compared to Round 1 of the MPM, there was a general decrease of Sudanese nationals in the country and, in particular, from 7,463 to 2,862 individuals in Beirut governorate, but there was an increase from 4,165 to 6,454 individuals reported in Mount Lebanon governorate.

majority of Sudanese nationals were reported in Beirut (25%), followed by Baabda (23%), El Meten (15%), Aley (12%), Sour (8%), and Saida (6%) districts. A total of seven districts had less than five per cent of Sudanese nationals each, namely Zahle, Bent Jbeil, Εl Nabatieh, Marjaayoun, Chouf, Jbeil and Keserwane. No Sudanese nationals were reported in 11 districts as noted in Table 1.

Within Beirut district, the neighbourhoods Chiyah (14%), Mazraa foncière (6%) and Ras Beyrouth foncière (6%) were the main areas where Sudanese communities were reportedly living.



In total, an estimated 11,539 Sudanese nationals were identified in Lebanon.
