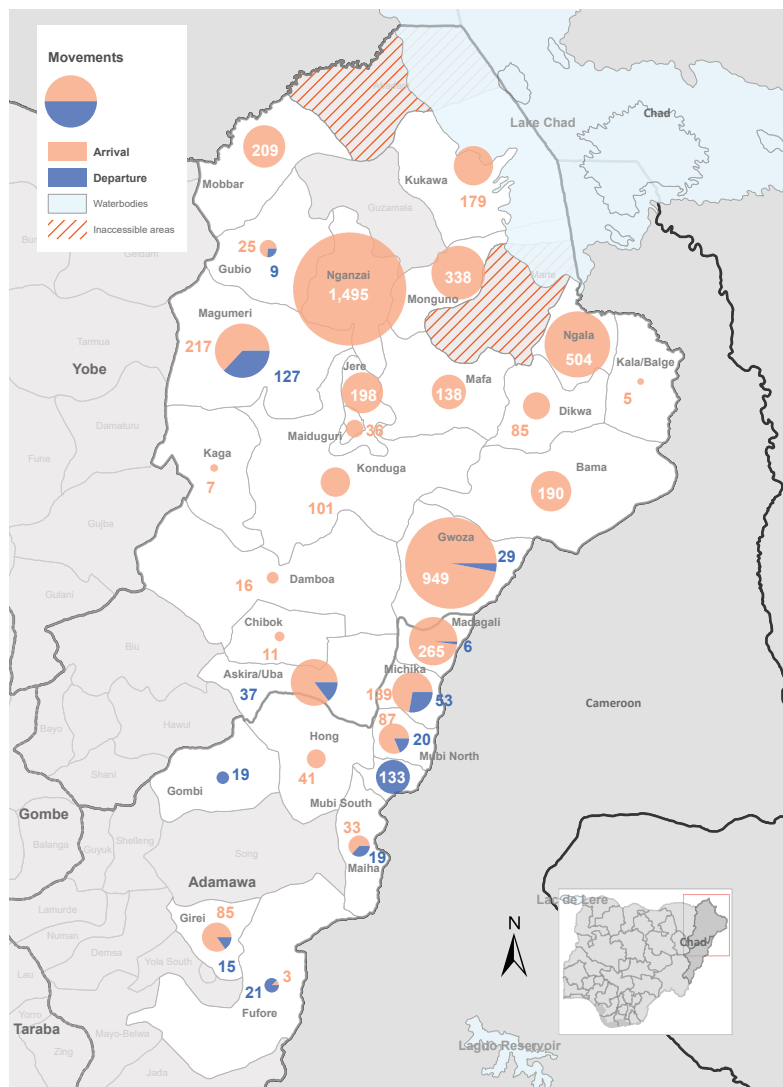

Summary

Nganzai (Triggers: voluntary relocation, attack): 1,495 INDS arrived at Gajiram from Wulo ward of Monguno during the reporting period.

Gwoza (Triggers: poor living conditions, military operation): 949 INDS arrived at Gwoza and 29 INDS left Gwoza during the reporting period. These include 392 arrivals at Pulka Transit Camp from surrounding wards (189 INDS), Bama (152 INDS) and Cameroon (51 INDS), 451 arrivals at Hausari ward, 98 arrivals at Wakane ward, 8 arrivals at GGSS Camp and 29 INDS who left Pulka for Ngoshe ward.

Ngala (Triggers: attack, poor living conditions): 504 INDS arrived at Ngala during the reporting period. These include 263 arrivals at International School Camp and 241 arrivals at Arabic Camp.

Monguno (Triggers: poor living conditions, military operation): 338 INDS arrived at Monguno during the reporting period. These include 95 arrivals at GGSS Camp, 62 arrivals at Water Board Camp and 181 arrivals at Monguno town.

Madagali (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions, attack): 265 INDS arrived at Madagali town and 6 INDS left Madagali during the reporting period. These include 128 INDS who arrived at the town from surrounding wards, 40 INDS who arrived from Mubi North, 30 arrivals from Waga, 21 arrivals from Damboa and Fufore LGAs respectively, 15 arrivals from Maiha, 10 arrivals from Akko and 6 INDS who left Girei LGA.

Magumeri (Triggers: attack, voluntary relocation): 217 INDS arrived at Gajiganna ward from surrounding villages due to recent attacks in the area and 127 INDS left Magumeri for Maiduguri.

Askira/Uba (Triggers: improved security, poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 217 new arrivals and 37 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba during the reporting period. These include 57 arrivals at Kopa/Multhafu ward, 46 arrivals at Dille/Huyim ward, 37 arrivals at Mussa ward, 48 arrivals at Ubba, 18 arrivals at Zadawa, 11 arrivals at Askira East, 17 INDS who left Askira East for Hong LGA in Adamawa State, 13 INDS who left in order to return to their place of origin in Gwoza and 7 INDS who left for Gumsuri ward of Damboa LGA.

Mobbar (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 209 INDS returned to Damasak from Difa in Niger republic.

Jere (Trigger: attack): 198 INDS arrived at Jere during the reporting period. These include 188 arrivals at Muna Moforo Camp from Dusuman ward and 10 INDS who arrived from Bolori 1 in Maiduguri.

Bama (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 190 INDS arrived at Bama during the reporting period. These include 84 arrivals at Banki Camp from Cameroon (65 INDS), Andara ward in Bama (11 INDS) and Maiduguri M.C. (8 INDS), 74 arrivals at General Hospital Camp from Kashemuri village in Gulumba ward of Bama and 11 arrivals at Kumshe community from Zurkuwa village in Gulumba ward of Bama.

Kukawa (Triggers: improved security, poor living conditions): 179 INDS arrived at Kukawa during the reporting period. These include 99 arrivals at Baga ward, 38 arrivals at Doro ward and 42 arrivals at Kukawa ward.

Michika (Triggers: attack, improved security): 139 INDS arrived at Michika and 53 INDS left Michika during the reporting period. These include 35 INDS who arrived from Keffi in Nasarawa State, 35 INDS who returned from Cameroon, 29 INDS who arrived from Mubi North, 18 arrivals from Taraba State, 15 arrivals from Niger State and 53 INDS who left for Askira/Uba.

Mafa (Triggers: attack, poor living conditions): 138 INDs arrived at Mafa during the reporting period. These include 127 arrivals at Mafa Camp from Jere (92 INDs) and Konduga (35 INDs), 6 INDs who arrived at Hausari Community and 5 INDs who arrived at Ajari community.

Konduga (Triggers: attack, improved security): 101 INDs arrived at Konduga during the reporting period. These include 72 arrivals at Jakane ward and 29 arrivals at Boarding Primary School Camp.

Mubi North (Triggers: poor living conditions, attack): 87 INDs arrived at Mubi North and 20 INDs left during the reporting period. These include 72 arrivals from Madagali LGA, 15 arrivals from Marwa in Cameroon and 20 INDs who left for Michika.

Girei (Triggers: attack, poor living conditions): 85 INDs arrived at Girei and 15 INDs left Girei during the reporting period. These include 60 INDs who arrived at the town from Madagali (30 INDs) and Numan (30 INDs) LGAs due to recent attacks in those areas, 21 INDs who arrived from Tongo and Yola North, 4 INDs who arrived from Fufore and 15 INDs who left the town for Gulak ward of Madagali LGA.

Dikwa (Triggers: voluntary relocation, military operations): 85 INDs arrived at Dikwa Central during the reporting period. These include 45 INDs who returned from Maiduguri, 19 INDs who arrived from Wasala ward of Bama due to military operations in the area, 14 arrivals from Boboshe ward of Dikwa, 4 arrivals from Ngala and 3 arrivals from Jere.

Mubi South (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 133 INDs left Mubi South to return to Gwoza.

Hong (Triggers: poor living conditions, attack): 41 INDs arrived at Hong during the reporting period. These include 36 INDs who arrived from Askira/Uba and 5 INDs who arrived from Madagali.

Maiduguri M.C. (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 36 INDs arrived at Maiduguri from Magumeri LGA.

Maiha (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 33 INDs arrived at Maiha town and 19 INDs left Maiha for Madagali.

Gubio (Triggers: poor living conditions, improved security): 25 INDs arrived at Gubio town from surrounding wards and 9 INDs left Gubio in order to return to Lawanti in Mobbar LGA.

Damboa (Triggers: military operations, poor living conditions): 15 INDs arrived at Abori Gate Camp and 1 IND arrived at General Hospital Camp in Damboa during the reporting period.

Chibok (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 11 INDs returned to Kautikari ward of Chibok from Gombi South in Hong LGA of Adamawa.

Gombi (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 19 INDs left Gombi for Chibok during the reporting period.

Kaga (Triggers: poor living conditions, attack): 7 INDs arrived at NRC Camp in Kaga from Magumeri (5 INDs) and Kaga (2 INDs).

Kala/Balge (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 5 INDs arrived at Rann in Kala/Balge from Dikwa.

Fufore (Triggers: voluntary relocation, improved security): 3 INDs arrived at Fufore town from Numan LGA due to improved security situation and 21 INDs left Pariya ward in Bulabulin/Wakane ward of Gwoza LGA.
