

Summary

Askira/Uba (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 113 new arrivals were recorded in Askira/Uba during the reporting period. These include 35 individuals (INDs) who arrived from Adamawa State, 63 INDs who arrived from surrounding wards in Askira/Uba Local Government Area (LGA), 5 INDs who arrived from Plateau State, 4 INDs who arrived from Jere, 3 INDs who arrived form Hawul LGA and 3 INDs who arrived from Potiskum in Yobe State.

Bama (Triggers: voluntary relocation, military operations): 199 INDs arrived at Bama and 4 INDs left Bama during the reporting period. These include 75 arrivals at Banki Camp, 124 arrivals at General Hospital Camp and 4 departures from Banki Camp.

Chibok (Trigger: improved security): 18 INDs left Mboa in Whumtaku ward of Chibok for Gumsuri ward of Damboa LGA.

Damboa (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 32 INDs arrived at Shuwari community in Damboa from Wajiroko in Azur Mulata ward of Damboa LGA.

Dikwa (Triggers: voluntary relocation, improved security): 27 INDs arrived at Dikwa during the reporting period. These include 16 arrivals at FOB arrival center and 11 INDs who returned to Bulabilin community from Gwange 2 ward of Maiduguri M.C.

Gwoza (Triggers: poor living conditions, military operation): 328 INDs arrived at Gwoza during the reporting period. These include 164

arrivals at Pulka Transit Camp, 22 arrivals at GSS Camp, 71 arrivals at Wakane community, 58 arrivals at Gadamayo from Kano and 13 arrivals at Dille community from Gulak ward of Madagali LGA.

Kala/Balge (Triggers: military operation, voluntary relocation): 270 INDs arrived at Rann in Kala/Balge during the reporting period. These include 197 INDs who arrived from Sangaya village in Rann due to military operations in the area, 18 INDs who arrived from Sabba village, 24 INDs who arrived from Gulumba ward of Bama and 31 INDs who arrived from Afade in Cameroon.

Konduga (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 20 INDs arrived at Boarding Primary School Camp Konduga from nearby Suraja/Bulaamsar ward of Konduga.

Kukawa (Triggers: improved security, poor living conditions): 93 INDs arrived at Kukawa and 13 INDs left Kukawa during the reporting period. These include 34 INDs who arrived from Maiduguri M.C., 34 INDs who arrived from Monguno, 14 INDs who arrived from Nganzai, 11 INDs who arrived from Fariri in Kukawa and 13 INDs who left Ajari for Lamisla/Jabamari ward of Maiduguri M.C.

Mafa (Trigger: poor living conditions): 42 INDs arrived at Mafa during the reporting period. These include 31 arrivals at Mafa Camp B and 11 arrivals at Mafa Camp A.

Maiduguri M.C. (Trigger: voluntary relocation): A 15 year old girl who was rescued from Sambisa was brought to Bakassi community from Gwoza Wakane by the military. 5 INDs left Bakassi for Gadula in Bauchi State.

Monguno (Triggers: poor living conditions, attack): 109 INDs arrived at Monguno during the reporting period. These include 76 arrivals from Marte LGA, 19 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from Kebbi State and 14 arrivals at Water Board Camp from Ngazai LGA.

Ngala (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 14 INDs arrived at International School Camp Ngala from Kusiri in Cameroon.

Nganzai (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 122 INDs arrived at Bakasi Camp during the reporting period. These include 93 INDs who arrived from Monguno and 29 INDs who arrived from Gajiram ward of Nganzai.
