IOM Yemen DTM's Rapid Displacement Tracking (RDT) tool collects data on estimated numbers of households forced to flee on a daily basis from their locations of habitual residence or displacement, allowing for regular reporting of new displacements<sup>1</sup> in terms of estimated numbers, causes of displacement, geography and needs. It also tracks returnees who returned to their location of habitual residence.

Between 1 and 7 January 2023, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 353 households (2,118 individuals)<sup>2</sup> who experienced displacement at least once.

Safety and security concerns as a result of the conflict were the main reason for displacement, accounting for 90 per cent (317 HHs) of the total and followed by economic reasons related to conflict, accounting for 10 per cent (36 HHs).

From 1 January to 7 January 2023, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 353 households (HH)<sup>3</sup> (2,118 Individuals) who experienced displacement at least once.

DTM received an alert for 230 HHs displaced to the Al Qubaytah district in Lahj governorate, most of whom were displaced from the border villages of the Dumnat Khadir and Mawiyah districts in Ta'iz which is near the Al Qubaytah District, close to active clashes. Most families were displaced on 4 and 5 January 2023. Due to the proximity to active frontlines, the De Facto Authorities (DFA) demanded local households through loudspeakers to leave their homes.





### DISPLACED HOUSEHOLDS BY LOCATION OF DISPLACEMENT AND DISTRICT OF ORIGIN




