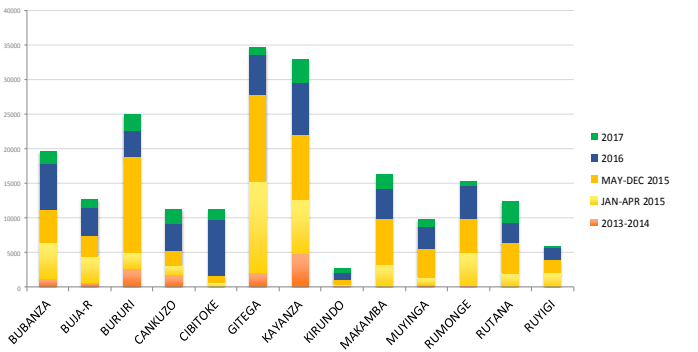
### Gender and Age Disaggregation
