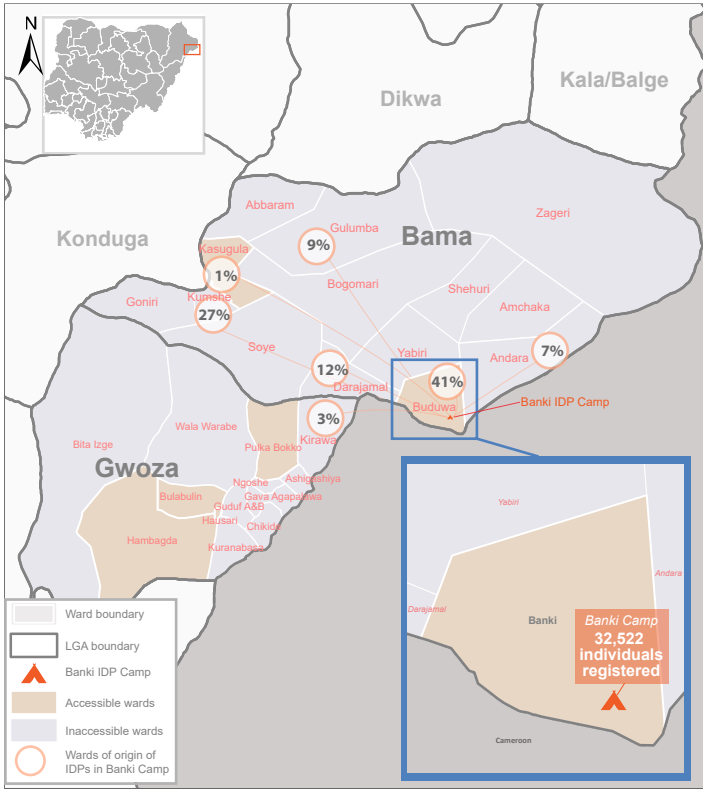
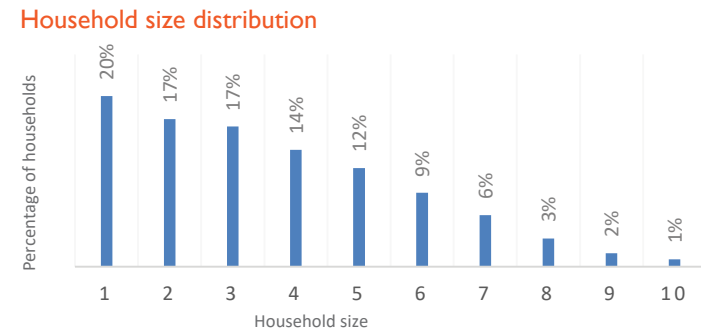
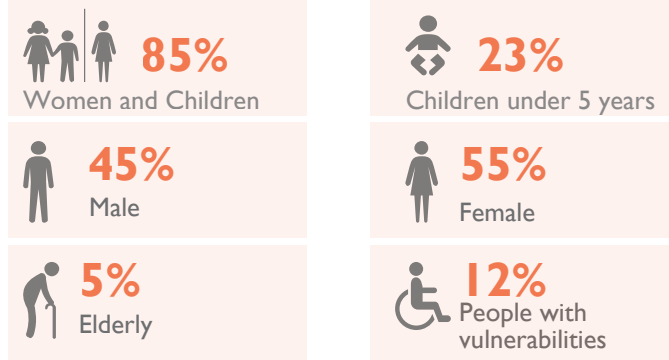


Biometric Registration Update | 1 November 2017



Total Registered
32,522 individuals | **8,688** households



Biometric Registration by IOM Nigeria's DTM Unit in Banki IDP Camp captured 8,688 displaced households, covering a total of 32,522 displaced persons in the site. The overall average family size is 3.7, with 37 per cent of the families comprising of 1–2 members, 31 per cent of the families comprising of 3–4 members, 21 per cent of the families comprising of 5–9 members, 9 per cent of the families comprising of 7–8 members and 3 per cent having 9–10 members.

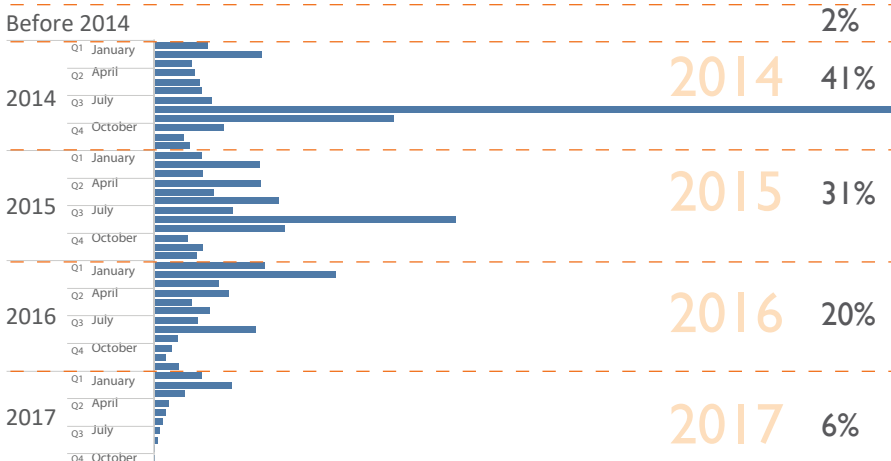
During the registration exercise, the enumerators collected vulnerability data to identify individuals that may require additional assistance. Out of the total population registered, about 12 per cent are people having at least one of the vulnerabilities. These figures are indicative and obtained through the interviewing of the head of household in the presence of other family members.

This Banki snapshot shows a downward correction of the number of people as against the assessment done earlier through the DTM mobility tracking, reinforcing the importance and accuracy of Biometric Registration. The reduction of 23 per cent was mainly on account of continuous population mobility and fluidity.
