

Shangil Tobay, North Darfur DTM Mission Report | July 2017



In response to several waves of displacement that took place since 2015 from Jebal Mara and its surrounding villages, and due to the need for a better understanding on the numbers, needs and living conditions, the DTM team was deployed to conduct registration and verification exercises of new IDPs in two camps in Dar el Salam locality, North Darfur State.

Out of the 1,665 households (6,179 individuals) reported IDPs, the DTM team registered and identified 1,388 households (5,090 individuals). The registered IDPs were mainly displaced in 2015 and 2016, while only few were displaced in 2017.

Apart from the IDPs displaced in 2017, all the IDPs received different humanitarian assistance. The 2015 and 2016 IDPs are receiving food assistance from WFP on a monthly basis.

Services



Health and Nutrition: None of the Primary Health Care (PHC) centers in Shangil Tobay and Shadad camps are operational. Dar el Salam Development Association (DDA) is providing Target Supplementary Feeding Program (TSFP) and Food Program for Moderate Acute Malnutrition (FPMAM) in two nutrition centers. These activities are mainly targeting children under the age of five as well as pregnant and lactating women. DDA is also conducting health education and hygiene promotion, clean up campaigns and garbage collection activities.



WASH: DDA is providing WASH activities to the entire population. Three motorized boreholes pumping water to 15 water points are the main sources of water for the IDPs (both new and old IDPs). A cost recovery system in which IDPs pay for water services has been established in the two camps to ensure sustainable water services. An addition of 63 latrines were constructed for the new IDPs.



Emergency Shelter/Non -Food Items: There is an urgent need to distribute ES/NFI for the IDPs who arrived in 2017.



Education: The new IDPs are enrolled in the 5 available schools (2,328 boys and 2,328 girls). Most of the teachers in these schools are volunteers with a few paid by the Ministry of Education (MoE). 434 students (263 boys and 171 girls) are the total number of students currently studying at the only high school available in Shangil Tobay town.
