The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is to collect information on large and sudden population movements as well as security and climactic emergencies. Information is collected through phone interviews with key informants and direct observation.

SUMMARY OF THE EVENT

Following fires of unknown origin that broke out on 15 and 16 February 2023 in Attrone and Sodelac neighbourhoods, situated in the town of Bagasola (sous-prefecture of Bagasola, Mamdi department), 113 households (541 individuals) were affected. However, these incidents caused considerable damage to houses, resulting in the loss of non-food items and food stocks.

OBSERVATIONS AND ANALYSIS



The 113 households that lost their homes to fire lost most of their non-food items. They reported an urgent need for non-food items including blankets, mats, cooking utensils, water storage containers and clothing.



The fires have caused significant damage to food stocks. Thus, humanitarian assistance is urgently needed in this situation. In addition, the affected individuals have not received any assistance other than the meals provided by the host community, but this assistance remains insufficient to cover their food needs.



The fires destroyed 110 houses and partially damaged 3 houses. In light of this critical situation, 6 households (26 individuals) are being hosted by host families while the 107 households (515 individuals) are homeless.



Vulnerable groups reported include 03 pregnant women, 03 female heads of household and 04 persons older than 60 years.
