
MOVEMENT SUMMARY

Totals
Arrivals: 4,470 individuals
Departures: 563 individuals
Transits: 20 individuals


Within the period of 3 to 8 January 2018, a total of 4,470 new arrivals, 563 departures and 20 transit movements were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Chibok, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gubio, Gwoza, Hong, Kala/Balge, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, and Nganzai LGAs in Borno and Adamawa States.

The main triggers included voluntary relocation (29%), poor living conditions (28%), conflicts/attacks (17%), involuntary relocation (16%), improved security (8%) and military operations (3%).



Movement triggers

Summary of major movements

Askira/Uba: (Triggers: involuntary relocation, poor living conditions): 327 individuals (INDs) were relocated from GGSS Camp in Askira/Uba to VTC Camp in Askira/Uba during the reporting period and 61 new arrivals were recorded at Huyim/Mussa community.

Gwoza: (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 891 arrivals and 14 departures were recorded in Gwoza during the reporting period. These include 435 arrivals at Wakane/Bulabulin community from Wuropatuje/Gude ward of Mubi-South LGA in Adamawa State, 258 arrivals at Pulka Transit Camp, 136 arrivals at Gadamayo community from Maisandari in Jere, 21 arrivals at Hausari community from Jere and 14 INDs who left Gwoza Wakane for Gamboru ward of Maiduguri.

Madagali: (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 358 arrivals and 29 departures were recorded in Madagali during the reporting period. These include 320 arrivals at Mararaban Madagali from Gwoza LGA due to poor living conditions, 29 arrivals at Madagali town from surrounding villages, 9 arrivals in Madagali town from Damboa LGA and 29 departures for Gwoza and Mubi South LGAs.

Gubio: (Trigger: attack): 374 arrivals were recorded at Gubio Town from Felo ward of Gubi LGA due to recent attacks in the area. Majority of the new arrivals were from Yanazannari village.
