

## ETT Report: No. 49 | 9 – 15 January 2018


### MOVEMENT SUMMARY

**Totals**  
**Arrivals: 7,000 individuals**  
**Departures: 1,210 individuals**  
**Transiting: 22 individuals**


Within the period of 9 to 15 January 2018, a total of 7,000 new arrivals, 1,210 departures and 22 transit movements were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Damboa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gubio, Gwoza, Hong, Jere, Kala/Balge, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala and Nganzaia LGAs in Borno and Adamawa States.

The main triggers included voluntary relocation (37%), improved security (23%), conflicts/attacks (20%), poor living conditions (15%), military operations (4%) and involuntary relocation (1%).



#### Movement triggers

#### Summary of major movements

**Gwoza: (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation, improved security):** 1,247 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza during the reporting period. These include 648 arrivals at Gadamayo community in Hausari ward of Gwoza, 329 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 135 arrivals at Wakane community in Bulabulin ward of Gwoza, 131 arrivals at Sabon Gari in Hausari ward and 4 arrivals at GSS Camp.

**Monguno: (Triggers: attacks, military operations):** 1,212 arrivals were recorded in Monguno during the reporting period. These include 903 arrivals from Gasarwa in Nganzai LGA due to recent attacks in the area and 309 arrivals at GGSS Camp from Ngelewa ward of Marte LGA due to military operations in the area.

**Mobbar: (Trigger: voluntary relocation):** 1,200 individuals (returnees) arrived at Damasak Central ward of Mobbar LGA from Difa in Niger Republic.

**Ngala: (Triggers: poor living conditions, improved security):** 931 arrivals were recorded in Ngala during the reporting period. These include 503 arrivals at International School Camp from Cameroon, 335 arrivals at Gamboru A from surrounding villages, 63 arrivals at International School Camp from Aja in Lagos State and 30 arrivals at International School Camp from Hausari community in Ngala.

**Nganzai: (Trigger: attacks):** 715 individuals arrived at Gajiram wards of Nganzai LGA from Gasarwa village in neighbouring Jigalta ward due to recent insecurity in the area.
