



TANGANYIKA - KALEMIE


The DTM team in Tanganyika is tracking the movement of IDPs and returnees following the inter-ethnic conflict that erupted in the region in 2016. The data below was collected through registration exercises and intention surveys on 1 and 20 October 2017 in seven displacement sites and six collective centres around on two rounds of assessments in the Kasai the capital Kalemie. Since data refer to displacement sites around Kalemie town, they are not representative of the territory of Kalemie as a total.



Evaluated displacement sites and collective centers around Kalemie.








The DTM activities started in Kasai in July 2017 following the ethnic and tribal




Main reason for displacement, 2017.






IDPs by territory of origin.




IDPs by surveyed territory.


The 13 IOM-coordinated displacement sites include 42,878 IDPs (12,409 Households).



IDPs at CCCM displacement sites in North Kivu, by territory.








Between 13 and 23 November baseline assessment covering 181 villages was conducted in the territory of Nyunzu. The figures below provide an overview of the results that were obtained.




Main reason for displacement, 2017.




Main reason for displacement, 2016.




Percentage of IDPs by assessed Health area.
