

SITUATION OVERVIEW



Since the collapse of the Somali central government in 1991, Somalia has suffered a highly complex protracted conflict characterized by changing political dynamics and power shifts. Although there have been improvements to the peace and security situation in Somalia since the formation of the Federal Government of Somalia (FGS) in 2012, the overall situation remains fragile with Al-Shabab (AS) a major obstacle to peace and security. Forced displacement remains an ongoing reality for people living in Somalia due to conflict,

environmental hardships, combined with inadequate resource distribution that is often exacerbated by clan-based, ideological differences and land and natural resource competition. In addition, Somalia is highly susceptible to the effects of climate change and extreme weather conditions and suffers periods of extended drought, flash floods, erratic rainfall, disruption to the monsoon seasons, strong winds, cyclones, sandstorms, and dust storms.

SITUATION OVERVIEW

In November 2021, the Federal Government of Somalia declared a state of emergency due to drought. Four consecutive failed rainy seasons - a climatic event not seen in at least 40 years - have affected 7 million people and displaced over 1 million individuals.

In this context, IOM Somalia's Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) implemented its Mobility Tracking (MT) exercise in Somalia. Baseline 2, an area based assessment, is the second step of Mobility Tracking is implemented at settlement level and aims to quantify presence of population categories.

The Baseline 2 covered **9,517 settlements** between February 2020 and January 2022. These settlements correspond to **6029** villages, **467 neighbourhoods**, **432 rural IDP sites**, and **2,589 urban IDP sites**. Among the total of **4,574,256 IDPs** reported, **3,664,282 reside in IDP sites** and **909,974 live** in the host communities. Regarding the returnee's population, **223,514 were returnees from abroad and 731,900 were previous IDPs** (returnees from internal displacement).

METHODOLOGY

Baseline 2 (B2) is a component of the Mobility Tracking exercise which aims to quantify presence of population categories, reasons for displacement, length of displacement and needs within defined locations at a given time. When the exercise is repeated across several rounds, it can capture mobility dynamics. Mobility tracking has 3 steps, and this report presents the findings from round 1 of step 2 (Baseline 2).

Step 1: Baseline 1 (B1) is conducted at the district level. This step gathers information on a list of settlements by district, including settlement names, settlement types (whether the settlement is in a rural or urban area and if it is an IDP site) and presence of population categories relevant to the exercise. In Somalia, the population categories are residents, IDPs, returnees from internal displacement and returnees from abroad. The key output is a master list and a map of settlements where the next step of assessment will be conducted. The master list is obtained thanks to the triangulation of datasets and a process of data cleaning and quality control.

Step 2: Baseline 2 (B2) is conducted at the settlement level (a village, a neighborhood, an urban IDP site, a rural IDP site). This step gathers estimates of households and individuals disaggregated by each population category. This information is collected in the field through key informants' interviews and direct observations. For inaccessible locations, key informants' interviews were conducted over the phone. Key informants are people with a good knowledge of a location.

Therefore, the data collected is based on their knowledge and is corroborated through direct observations, data cleaning, quality control and triangulation with other data sources.

Step 3: Multi-Sectorial Location Assessment (MSLA) is conducted at the settlement level. This step gathers information on needs and gaps.

This round 1 of Baseline 2 initiated in 2020, covered 17 regions:

LIMITATIONS

The information collected for Baseline 2 is based on the perceptions of key informants, so the findings should be considered as estimates.

The data has been collected over two years. Somalia's context is rapidly evolving, and population dynamics are very fluid due to frequent and varied shocks (e.g. flooding in 2020 and current drought). As a result, some regions may have observed significant changes since the assessment. In particular, the drought which started in 2021 has significantly impacted displacement patterns, IDPs numbers and IDPs presence in some areas.

Similarly, land use can change at a very fast pace. Consequently, some locations are missing if they were not existing at the time of the assessment, not reported by any key informants, or inaccessible because of access or insecurity issues.

In addition, due to access constraints (for hard-to-reach areas) and due to the COVID-19 pandemic (especially in 2020), some key informants' interviews were conducted remotely over the phone. Remote data collection prevented verifications of key informant declarations with enumerators direct observations.
