



59% increase in displacement from the previous week (235 HHs)

IOM Yemen DTM's Rapid Displacement Tracking (RDT) tool collects data on estimated numbers of households forced to flee on a daily basis from their locations of habitual residence or displacement, allowing for regular reporting of new displacements¹ in terms of estimated numbers, causes of displacement, geography and needs. It also tracks IDP returnees who returned to their location of habitual residence.

Between 26 March and 1 April 2023, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 373 households (3,238 individuals)² who experienced displacement at least once.

Natural disaster in the form of heavy rains and floods were the main reason for displacement accounting for 85 per cent (316 HHs) of the total, followed by displacement due to the ongoing conflict (14%; 52 HHs), and economic reasons related to conflict (1%; 5 HHs).


From 1 January to 1 April 2023, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 2,470 households (HH)³ (14,820 Individuals) who experienced displacement at least once.

- 1. Displacement in Yemen refers to the 13 governorates where IOM DTM's team has access, namely: Abyan, Ad Dali', Aden, Al Bayda, Al Hodeidah, Al Jawf, Al Maharah, Hadramawt, Lahj, Ma'rib, Shabwah, Socotra, Ta'iz.
- 2. IOM DTM estimates that one household represents six individuals.

SHABWA GOVERNORATE FLOODS


Displaced Population:



On the evening of 29 March 2023, Jalah in Radum district of Shabwah governorate was subjected to heavy rains causing heavy flooding. While the extent of the material damage is reportedly considerable, there have been no reports of deaths or injuries. In total, 294 families had to flee their homes to neighboring areas.

IOM found that 30 houses were completely destroyed and 35 houses partially damaged rendering these uninhabitable. At the time of assessment on 31 March 2023, the rains had not yet ceased to flood the area.
