

SABRATHA

On the 7th of November 400 families returned to Sabratak with the reopening of schools. 50 families had not returned to Sabratak as they are in need of NFIs, mattresses, and house repairs.

AI MAYA


On 7th November clashes started in Al Maya, Muhallah Maamoura and are ongoing. On 19th of November over 5,000 migrants were found detained on a farm in Al Maya. A further 600 migrants are currently housed in a warehouse near the coast.

AI AZIZYAH

On 2nd November, 500 families were displaced from AlAzizyah to different muhallas within the same baladiya such as Al saidiyah, Al Amriyah and Al sharkiyah due to the clashes that occurred in this location. On 11th of November, 350 households returned to their homes.
