SUMMARY OF MOVEMENTS


Totals

Arrivals: 6,310 individuals
Departures: 781 individuals
Transits: 33 individuals


Within the period of 13 to 20 February 2018, a total of 6,310 arrivals, 781 departures and 33 transit movements were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Chibok, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Gubio, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Kaga, Kala/Balge, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South LGAs in Borno and Adamawa States.

The main triggers of movements were poor living conditions (37%), voluntary relocation (24%), military operations (16%), ongoing conflict (11%), improved security (8%) and fear of attack (4%).



Number of individuals by movement triggers

Summary of major movements

Gwoza: (Triggers: military operations, poor living conditions, voluntary relocation, improved security): 1,538 arrivals were recorded in Gowza during the reporting period. These include 506 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 54 arrivals at GSS Camp, 780 arrivals at Wakane town, 179 arrivals at Gadamayou community and 19 arrivals at Hambagda/Limankara ward of Gwoza.

Mobbar: (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 873 individuals (returnees) arrived at Damasak Central ward of Mobbar LGA from Difa/Shettimari in Niger Republic. They are in need of food and NFI assistance.

Kukawa: (Triggers: improved security, poor living conditions): 521 arrivals were recorded in Kukawa during the reporting period. These include 238 arrivals at Baga ward, 180 arrivals at Doro ward, 94 arrivals at Kukawa ward and 9 arrivals at Segewa ward.

Ngala: (Triggers: ongoing conflict, poor living conditions, voluntary relocation, improved security): 457 arrivals were recorded in Ngala during the reporting period. These include 223 arrivals at International School camp, 150 arrivals at Arabic camp, 38 arrivals at Gamboru community and 46 arrivals at Government Day School in Gamboru A ward of Ngala.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.
