
# SUMMARY OF MOVEMENTS




Arrivals: 7,063 individuals
Departures: 1,624 individuals
Transit: 79 individuals

Within the period of 6 to 12 March 2018, a total of 7,063 arrivals, 1,624 departures and 79 transit movements were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Balanga, Bama, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Kaga, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola-North, and Yola-South LGAs in Borno and Adamawa States.

The main triggers of movements were poor living conditions (33%), voluntary relocation (26%), improved security (17%), ongoing conflict (10%), fear of attack (9%), military operations (4%), and conflict with herdsmen (1%).







#### **Major movements**

Gwoza: (Triggers: poor living conditions, improved security, military operations): 1,248 arrivals and 37 transit movements were recorded in Gwoza during the reporting period. These include 770 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 203 arrivals at GSS Camp, 251 arrivals at Wakane community, 24 arrivals at Limankara town and 37 individuals who were transiting through Hausari/Gadamayo ward of Gwoza LGA to Kolofata in Cameroon.

Mobbar: (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 1,150 individuals (returnees) arrived at Damasak Central ward of Mobbar LGA from Diffa in Niger.

Bama: (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions, ongoing conflict): 877 arrivals and 31 departures were recorded in Bama during the reporting period. These include 493 arrivals at GSSSS Camp, 31 individuals who left GSSSS Camp for Pulka and 384 arrivals at Banki Camp of which 266 were from Mora in Cameroon and 118 were from Gulumba ward of Bama LGA.

Ngala: (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation, ongoing conflict): 878 arrivals were recorded at Ngala during the reporting period. These include 409 arrivals at International School Camp, 305 arrivals at Arabic Camp and 164 arrivals at Gamboru ward of Ngala LGA.
