## MOVEMENT TREND TRACKING

Baidoa: 16-22 February 2018

## KEY MESSAGES

- This week there were 526 new arrivals through Baidoa checkpoints and Zero Exits. This is the second week in a row with no exit. The key driving factors for displacements in to Baidoa this week were eviction in the Somali capital, Mogadishu, prolonged drought and increasing insecurity at the villages of origin.
- All of the new entries cited eviction from Mogadishu (30\%), Insecurity (28\%), food (21\%), water (16\%) and lack of access to health (5\%) as the key driving factors for displacement into the IDP sites in Baidoa.
- Like the past few weeks, all arrivals this week came from the district of Hudur (40\%), Kahda district, Mogadishu, Banadir region, (34\%) or Baidoa district (26\%). The new entries said that their intended destinations inside the town were the IDP sites of Nimatu Rabi (33\%), Geele (24\%), Bakar yarey (23), abal 3 (8\%), Hereri kadiyow (7\%) Dolow (5\%).
- There were no exits recorded for the second week, this is attributed to the prolonged drought, and increasing insecurity at the villages of origin.

## METHODOLOGY

Movement Trend Tracking (MTT) is a movement monitoring exercise that tracks people who are moving in or out of sites on a semi-permanent or permanent basis. MTT aims to gauge the pulse of movements in and out of sites in Baidoa.

MTT figures should not be considered official updates to the population figures of the sites. Rather, the data represents the intentions of IDPs and points towards general trends in their movements.

In Baidoa, IOM enumerators are positioned at the 3 main checkpoints in and out of town (shown on the map on the right) from 6:30am until $5: 30 \mathrm{pm}$, 7 days a week.

From these checkpoints, the teams identify people who are moving in or out of Baidoa with luggage. Interviews are done with the
 individual or the head of household.

MTT aims to complement existing information management products on displacements and movements in Baidoa, by providing site level specific data on population movements on a regular basis, to assist agencies operating in sites and settlements with key information on: demographics of movement, area of origin, area of return/onward movement, reasons for movement and movement trends over time.
