# **SUMMARY** OF MOVEMENTS


Arrivals: 5,434 individuals


**Departures: 974 individuals** 


Within the period of 20 to 26 March 2018, a total of 5,434 arrivals and 974 departures were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Gubio, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi North, Mubi South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola North and Yola South LGAs in Borno and Adamawa States.


The main triggers of movements were poor living conditions (47%), improved security (17%), voluntary relocation (16%), fear of attack (11%), ongoing conflict

(8%) and military operations (1%).









#### **Summary of major movements**

Gwoza: 1,003 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza during the reporting period. These include 295 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 33 arrivals at GSS Camp, 248 arrivals at Gadamayo community, 386 arrivals at Hausari community from Adamawa, 10 arrivals at Limankara community and 31 arrivals at Wakane community. Triggers included poor living conditions, ongoing conflict and improved security.

Bama: 388 arrivals were recorded in Bama during the reporting period. These include 191 arrivals at Banki Camp and 197 arrivals at GSSSS Camp. Triggers include poor living conditions, improved security/access and voluntary relocation.

The government reopened the Maiduguri-Bama-Banki Road on 24 March 2018 and as a result more movements have been observed through the route. With the improved access to Bama-Banki, there is an increased likelihood that more arrivals and return of IDPs of Bama origin currently in other LGAs to their locality of origin will be observed in the coming periods.

Ngala: 482 arrivals were recorded in Ngala during the reporting period. These include 346 arrivals at International School Camp and 136 arrivals at Gamboru community. The majority, 252 individuals out of the 482 new arrivals in Ngala were from Cameroon, 41 individuals were from Njamena in Chad, 168 individuals were from Dikwa LGA and 21 individuals returned to Ngala from Oyo State. Triggers include poor living conditions and voluntary relocation.

Askira/Uba: 394 arrivals and 34 departures were recorded at Askira/Uba during the reporting period. Most of the arrivals were at locations in Uba, Huyim, Lassa and Zadawa wards of Askira/Uba LGA. Triggers include improved security, poor living conditions, fear of attack and voluntary relocation.
