
Arrivals: 6,159 individuals


Departures: 1,312 individuals


Transits: 114 individuals

Within the period of 27 March to 2 April 2018, a total of 6,159 arrivals, 1,312 departures and 114 transit movements were recorded, including 3,000 IDPs who were relocated from Dalori Camps in Maiduguri to Bama LGA. Other movements were also captured in Askira/Uba, Biu, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Gubio, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Kaga, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi North, Mubi South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Borno and Adamawa States.

The main triggers of movements were assisted voluntary relocation (40%), poor living conditions (27%), improved security (13%), voluntary relocation (12%), military operations (4%), ongoing conflict (3%) and fear of attacks (1%).







Summary of major movements

Bama: 3,087 arrivals and 34 departures were recorded in Bama during the reporting period. These include 3,000 IDPs who were relocated by the Government of Nigeria from Dalori Camps in Maiduguri to Shehuri and Kasugula communities in Bama, 45 arrivals at Banki Camp from Cameroon, 18 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from Dikwa and 34 departures from Bama to Gwoza. The movements from Maiduguri to Bama were government assisted.

Gwoza: 859 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza during the reporting period. These include 464 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 294 arrivals at GSS Camp, 29 arrivals at Gadamayo community from Cameroon and 72 arrivals at Hausari ward of Gwoza LGA. Movement triggers included poor living conditions and military operations.

Madagali: 73 arrivals and 261 departures were recorded in Madagali during the reporting period. These include 73 arrivals at Madagali town from Mubi, 84 persons how left Madagali for Yola due to ongoing conflict in the area, 160 individuals who left Madagali for Gwoza and 17 individuals who left for Yola North. Movement triggers included improved security, ongoing conflict and voluntary relocation.

Mobbar: 303 arrivals were recorded at Damasak Central ward of Mobbar during the reporting period. All the arrivals were from Difa, Niger Republic. The movements were voluntary.
