


Arrivals: 3,795 individuals


Departures: 515 individuals

Within the period of 10 to 16 April 2018, a total of 4,310 movements were recorded, including 3,795 arrivals and 515 departures at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Kala/Balge, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South LGAs of Borno and Adamawa States.

The main triggers of movements were poor living conditions (39%), voluntary relocation (31%), improved security (18%), military operations (5%), ongoing conflict (5%) and fear of attacks (2%).







Summary of major movements

Gwoza: 1,125 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza Local Government Area (LGA) during the reporting period. These include 343 new arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 12 arrivals at GSS Camp, 588 arrivals at Wakane community and 182 arrivals at Gadamayo community. The movements were voluntary.

Ngala: 649 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA during the reporting period. These include 513 returnee arrivals from Cameroon, 84 arrivals at Arabic Camp from Rann in Kala/Balge LGA and 52 arrivals at International School Camp from Ngomaram community in Ngala, due to eruption of conflict in the area. Many (about 193 individuals) of the returnees were brought to Ngala by the Cameroonian Government from Waza in Cameroon and were taken to Arabic Camp. Most of the returnees are from Bama.

Bama: 372 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA during the reporting period. These include 150 arrivals at Banki Camp and 222 arrivals at GSSSS Camp, Bama. The movements were voluntary.

Kukawa: 191 arrivals and 32 departures were recorded at Kukawa LGA during the reporting period. These include 123 arrivals at Baga ward, 42 arrivals at Doro ward, 26 arrivals at Kukawa ward and 32 departures for Hadeja LGA of Jigawa State. The movements were triggered by poor living conditions and improved security/access.
