

REGISTERED IDP AREA BASELINE ASSESSMENT

UKRAINE - ROUND 25

JUNE 2023

OVERVIEW

The Registered IDP Area Baseline Assessment provides granular data on the number and geographic location of officially registered internally displaced people (IDPs). This report assesses registered IDP presence at the raion level, also mapping the recorded change since the previous round. Round 25 presents the data of the registered IDP population disaggregated by sex, age and state-recognized disability status.¹

The data collected for the Area Baseline Assessment Round 25 reflects the up-to-date local administrative register of the IDP population as of 30 June 2023, equivalent to a total of 3,650,338 registered IDPs. Registered IDP figures were collected for 1,039 hromadas (78% of all hromadas covered in Ukrainian government-controlled areas). Data disaggregated by age, sex and disability status were provided for around 76 per cent of the administrative units covered.

For this assessment, IOM define IDPs as persons who officially registered as fleeing their habitual place of residence due to the current war in Ukraine.


1 Information on disability status as conveyed in this report does not reflect international standards guidelines for the inclusion of persons with disabilities but does reflect disability status as recognized by the Government of Ukraine.


The data in this report was sourced locally from oblast authorities and their official IDP registration data per oblast, raion, and hromada, where available. As such, it likely represents an undercount of those who have been de facto forced to flee their homes.

KEY INSIGHTS


- Among oblasts, Kharkivska (500,059), Dnipropetrovska (386,553) and Kyivska (332,457) have the highest number of officially registered IDPs.
- At the raion level, Kharkivskyi (278,286), Kyivska (258,875), and Dniprovska (165,657) host the highest number of registered IDPs.
- The collapse of the Nova Kakhovka dam on 6 June contributed to the displacement of several thousand people from Khersonska, Dnipropetrovska and Zaporizka Oblasts.
- Across the country, around 4% of registered IDPs have a state-recognized disability status.

CHANGES IN REGISTERED IDP FIGURES

Changes in the caseload of registered IDPs are measured controlling for variations in the area covered compared to the previous round. The map above shows the changes in raions that were assessed in both Rounds 24 and 25.

In line with the recent trends, the number of registered IDPs in eastern and southern oblasts continues to rise, albeit at a relatively moderate pace. The most significant increases were observed in Kharkivska (+8,500 registered IDPs from R24), Kyiv city (5,400), Donetska (4,000), Dnipropetrovska (3,400), Khersonska (3,400), Zaporizka (3,350).

Furthermore, the destruction of the Nova Kakhovka dam on June 6th played a crucial role in shaping the displacement dynamics. According to Key Informants (KIs), several thousand people were displaced from the flood-affected areas downstream of the dam. While a significant portion of IDPs remained in Khersonska Oblast, thousands displaced to neighbouring and non-neighbouring oblasts. Notably, Odeska and Mykolaivska Oblasts saw an increase of 2,500 and 2,000 registered IDPs, respectively. Furthermore, KIs in Odeska Oblast, reported that of those displaced in Odeska due to the floods, most have settled in the city of Odesa.

Additionally, the dam breach likely had a considerable impact on displacement in the areas surrounding the Kakhov Reservoir, affecting Dnipropetrovska, Zaporizka, and Khersonska Oblasts. Falling water levels in the reservoir have put thousands of people at risk of losing access to safe drinking and technical water essential for household and agriculture use. KIs reported that this situation, combined with the ongoing shelling in recent months, likely contributed to a surge in displacement, particularly to urban centers around the reservoir.

Registered displacement is also significantly increasing in other parts of the country. A sharp rise is observed in Kharkivskyi Raion, with approximately 7,200 new registrations, primarily from other areas within the same oblast and Donetska Oblast. In Kyiv city, the registered IDP population grew by over 5,000 individuals in June and by several tens of thousands since the beginning of the year. While several factors may contribute to the influx of displaced individuals to the country's capital, KIs emphasized that job opportunities and better economic conditions are among the primary driving factors.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Overall, central and western oblasts have a higher proportion of registered IDPs in the younger age group. For instance, the share of children among registered IDPs in Zakarpatska (36%), Chernivetska (35%), Lvivska (32%), Vinnytska (31%), Ivano-Frankivska and Volynska (29% each) Oblasts is above the national average. In contrast, a relatively high proportion of registered IDPs aged 60 and over are observed in Kharkivska (29%) and Donetska (27%) Oblasts.

At the same time, the proportion of female IDPs registered in all western oblasts is substantially higher than in the rest of the country, reaching its maximum in Ivano-Frankivska and Zakarpatska (66% each) Oblasts.

These trends seem to indicate that displaced women and children tend to register as IDPs further away from the areas affected by the war, while the displaced older population tends to remain closer to their habitual place of residence.

METHODOLOGY


Data for the Area Baseline Assessment is collected through a network of Key Informants within the local oblast administration bodies across the country. Every month, IOM records figures on registered displacement directly from the regional authorities, as well as sex, age and disability disaggregated estimates among the registered IDP population. In addition, IOM collects feedback from local authorities to explain changes across round and to provide interpretation for the trends observed.

In line with the established Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) approach, IOM endeavors to regularly collect data on the registered IDP population in all territories under the control of the Government of Ukraine. While data collection capacity grows, geographical coverage can change across rounds.

The figures provided in this report reflect the recorded registered IDP population, and as such do not include displaced individuals who have not officially registered with the local authorities. 
Figure 1: Age distribution among registered IDPs, by oblast.*

■ Male ■ Female


