Totals


Arrivals: 5,777 individuals

Departures: 441 individuals


Within the period of 24 April to 2 May 2018, a total of 6,218 movements were recorded, including 5,777 arrivals and 441 departures at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Gubio, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Kaga, Kala/Balge, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South LGAs of Borno and Adamawa States.

The main triggers of movements were: poor living conditions (38%), voluntary relocation (35%), military operations (11%), improved security (8%), ongoing conflict (7%), fear of attacks (1%).



Number of individuals by movement triggers

Summary of major movements

Gwoza: 1,041 arrivals and 73 departures were recorded in Gwoza Local Government Area (LGA) during the reporting period. These include 223 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 501 arrivals at Bulabulin/Wakane ward, 175 arrivals at Gwoza INEC Office from Balkali community due to recent conflict in the area, 142 arrivals at Hausari ward and 73 departures for Adamawa State from Pulka. The movement triggers include ongoing conflict, voluntary relocation and poor living conditions.

Bama: 866 arrivals and 5 departures were recorded in Bama LGA during the reporting period. These include 314 arrivals at Buduwa ward from Cameroon, 167 arrivals at Banki Camp, 364 arrivals at GSSSS Camp, 21 arrivals at Buduwa community from Gulumba ward of Bama and 5 departures from GSSSS Camp for Gwoza LGA. The movement triggers include ongoing conflict, voluntary relocation and poor living conditions.

Damboa: 842 arrivals were recorded at Damboa LGA during the reporting period. These include 731 arrivals at the New IDP Camp in Damboa from Galtumari ward of BIU LGA, 22 arrivals at Abori Gate Camp, 84 arrivals at Abachari community and 5 arrivals at Shuwari community. The movements were voluntary.

Dikwa: 749 arrivals were recorded in Dikwa LGA during the reporting period. These include 706 individuals (296 Households) who were brought by the military to FOB Screening Centre in Dikwa from Bama LGA, 39 individuals who arrived at IOM-Camp Masarmari from Arabic Camp in Ngala LGA and 4 individuals who arrived at Bulabulin community from Hausa Quarters in EDO State.
