

Arrivals: 5,017 individuals

Departures: 864 individuals


Within the period of 3 – 8 May 2018, a total of 5,881 movements were recorded, including 5,017 arrivals and 864 departures at locations in Askira/Uba, Balanga, Bama, Biu, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombe, Gombi, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Kaga, Kala/Balge, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Adamawa, Borno and Gombe States.

Assessments identified the following main triggers of movements: poor living conditions (35%), military operations (24%), voluntary relocation (16%), fear of attacks (11%), improved security (10%), ongoing conflict (3%) and farming activities (1%).


Number of individuals by movement triggers

Summary of major movements

Gwoza: 857 arrivals and 73 departures were recorded in Gwoza LGA during the reporting period. These include 269 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 526 arrivals at Bulabulin ward of Gwoza LGA from Adamawa State, 55 arrivals at Hausari ward from Jere LGA, 7 arrivals at Wakane community from Pulka and 73 individuals who left Pulka for Daware ward of Gwoza LGA. The primary movement triggers for movements recorded in these LGAs include poor living conditions and improved security.

Dikwa: 902 individuals arrived at the FOB Screening Centre in Dikwa from Wasala ward of Bama LGA (843 individuals) and Boboshe ward of Dikwa LGA (59 individuals), due to military operations in the areas.

Bama: 626 arrivals and 5 departures were recorded in Bama LGA during the reporting period. These include 215 arrivals at GSSSS Camp, 345 arrivals at Banki Camp, 66 arrivals at GGSS Camp and 5 individuals who left GSSSS Camp for Wakane in Gwoza LGA. The main movement triggers include voluntary relocation, military operations and poor living conditions.

Ngala: 595 arrivals were recorded at Ngala LGA during the reporting period. These include 523 arrivals at Arabic Camp (136 were from Cameroon), 41 arrivals at International School Camp and 31 arrivals at Gamboru ward of Ngala LGA from Cameroon.
