

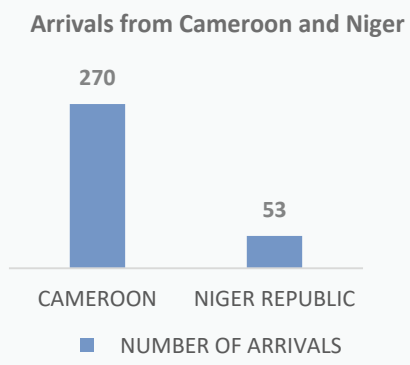
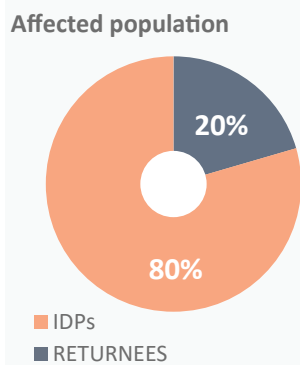
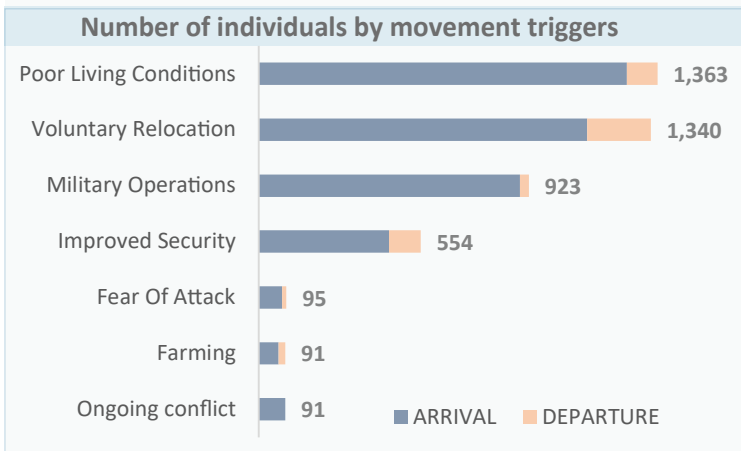
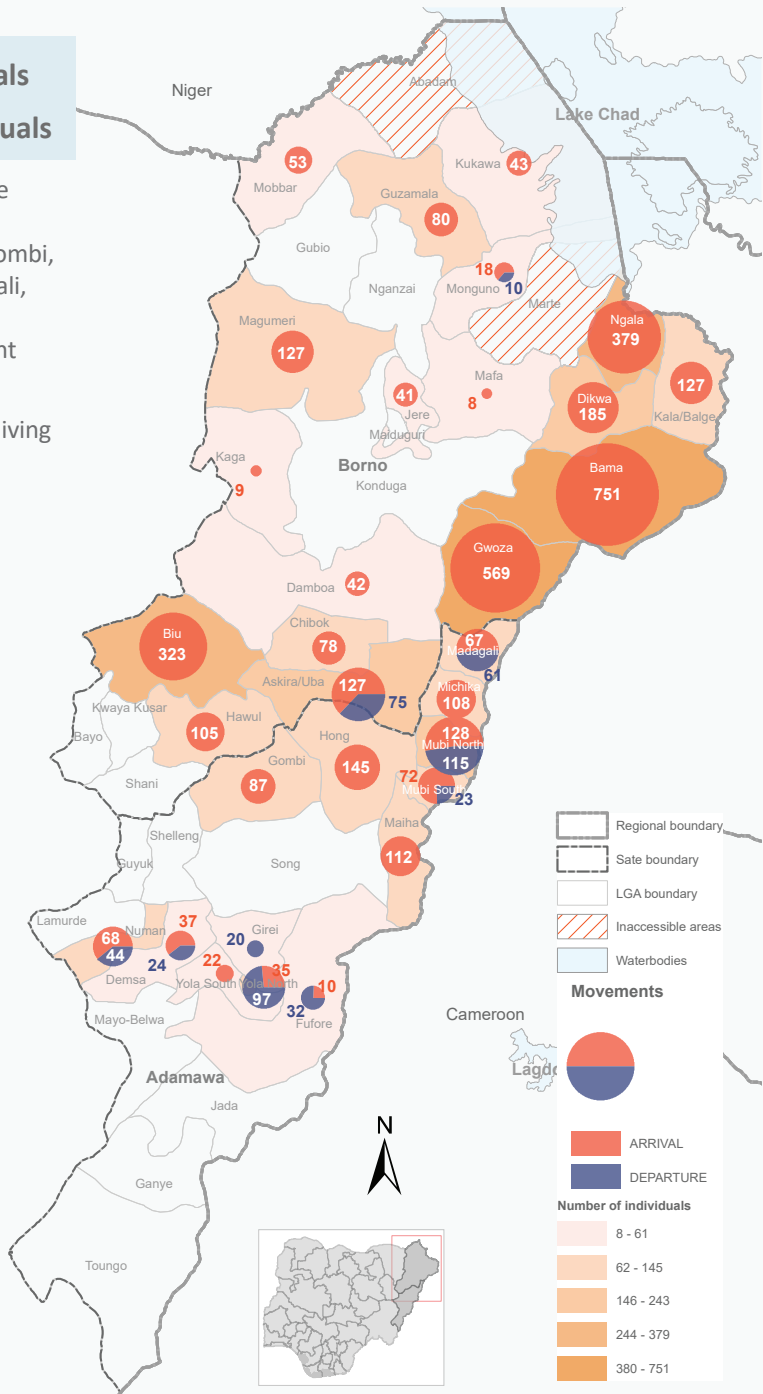
ETT Report: No. 68 | 23 – 29 May 2018

SUMMARY OF MOVEMENTS

Total Arrivals: 3,956 individuals
Departures: 501 individuals

Within the period of 23 – 29 May 2018, a total of 4,457 movements were recorded, including 3,956 arrivals and 501 departures at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Kaga, Kala/Balge, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Adamawa and Borno States.

Assessments identified the following main triggers of movements: poor living conditions (31%), voluntary relocation (30%), military operations (21%), improved security (12%), fear of attacks (2%), ongoing conflict (2%) and farming activities (2%).



Summary of major movements

Bama: 751 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA. These include 511 arrivals at GSSSS Camp and 240 arrivals at Banki Camp. The main movement triggers include voluntary relocation, poor living conditions and military operations.

Gwoza: 569 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA. These include 243 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 160 arrivals at Gadamayo community, 85 arrivals at Hausari Camp and 81 arrivals at Bulabulin ward of Gwoza LGA. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions and improved security.

Ngala: 379 arrivals were recorded at Ngala LGA. These include 343 arrivals at Arabic Camp, due to military operations at Wulgo ward of Ngala LGA and 36 arrivals at Gamboru community, from Cameroon (21 individuals) and Yobe State (15 individuals). The main movement triggers include military operations and voluntary relocation.

Biu: 323 individuals arrived at Biu LGA. These include 222 individuals who arrived at Miringa ward of Biu from Damboa LGA, 71 individuals who arrived at Donchiba ward from Gujiba in Yobe State and 30 individuals who arrived at Yawi ward from Damboa LGA. All the movements were voluntary relocations.
