



SUMMARY OF MOVEMENTS


Total
Arrivals: 4,344 individuals
Departures: 1,200 individuals

Within the period of 30 May – 5 June 2018, a total of 5,544 movements were recorded, including 4,344 arrivals and 1,200 departures at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Gubio, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Adamawa and Borno States.


Assessments identified the following main triggers of movements: poor living conditions (36%), voluntary relocation (28%), military operations (28%), improved security (7%) and ongoing conflict (1%).




Number of individuals by movement triggers

Summary of major movements

Askira/Uba: 517 arrivals were recorded at Askira/Uba LGA. These include 325 arrivals from Lassa/Chull wards of Askira/Uba, 6 arrivals from Bauchi State, 177 arrivals from Biu LGA and 9 arrivals from Gwoza LGA. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions and improved security. Further reports indicates an attempted return of IDPs in Mussa and Lassa wards of Askira/Uba to their ward of origin (Huyim/Dille ward) in order to engage in farming activities, a trend that has been ongoing since May 2018, however on 1 June 2018, the Nigerian Military declared that the location remains unsafe for civilian population, thereby instructing all the IDPs to move back to Mussa/Lassa wards. An estimated 896 individuals have been observed departing Huyim/Dille ward for Mussa ward between 2 and 5 June 2018.

Gwoza: 703 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA. These include 481 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka from Cameroon (355 individuals) and other surrounding locations in Gwoza (126 individuals); 195 arrivals at Hausari/Gadamayo ward; and 27 arrivals at Bulabulin/Gwoza Wakane ward. The main trigger of these movements was poor living conditions.

Bama: 651 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA. These include 350 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from Abbaram/Bomari axis, due to military operations in the area; and 301 arrivals at Banki Camp from Cameroon (189 individuals) and Gulumba ward of Bama (112 individuals). The main movement triggers include military operations and voluntary relocation.

Biu: 518 individuals arrived at Biu LGA from Damboa LGA (416 individuals) and Gur ward of Biu LGA (102 individuals). These movements were voluntary.
