FLASH UPDATE • STORM DANIEL IN NORTHEASTERN LIBYA




HIGHLIGHTS

- There are around **40,018** individuals¹ who remain displaced after storm Daniel made landfall in northeastern Libya on 11 September 2023 with some households reportedly moving back home. In **Almari**, for example, many families who were forced out of their homes have returned. The number of damaged houses remains above 350. There are around 285 displaced individuals from Derna in the city of Almari (and 800 individuals displaced in total).
- Some households who were displaced from Derna and had moved to **Misrata** reportedly had to relocate because they were unable to find housing.
- According to key informants there are around 16,000 displaced individuals in **Derna** and surrounding areas². some roads in the affected areas are being reopened although movement between the eastern and western parts of the city continues to be heavily restricted.

¹ The variations in numbers of displaced individuals reported is related to the quickly evolving situation and limited access of the field assessment team. ² The number of displaced individuals identified by key informants within Derna is likely to be an underestimation given the dynamic context, and the complex process of registering displaced individuals. The number of displaced individuals for Derna (16,000) does not include those displaced in Derna's surrounding areas (e.g. Ain Mara, Algubba, Alfateah and Martuba) nor those who have been able to relocate outside of Derna (e.g. in Benghazi or Tripoli)
