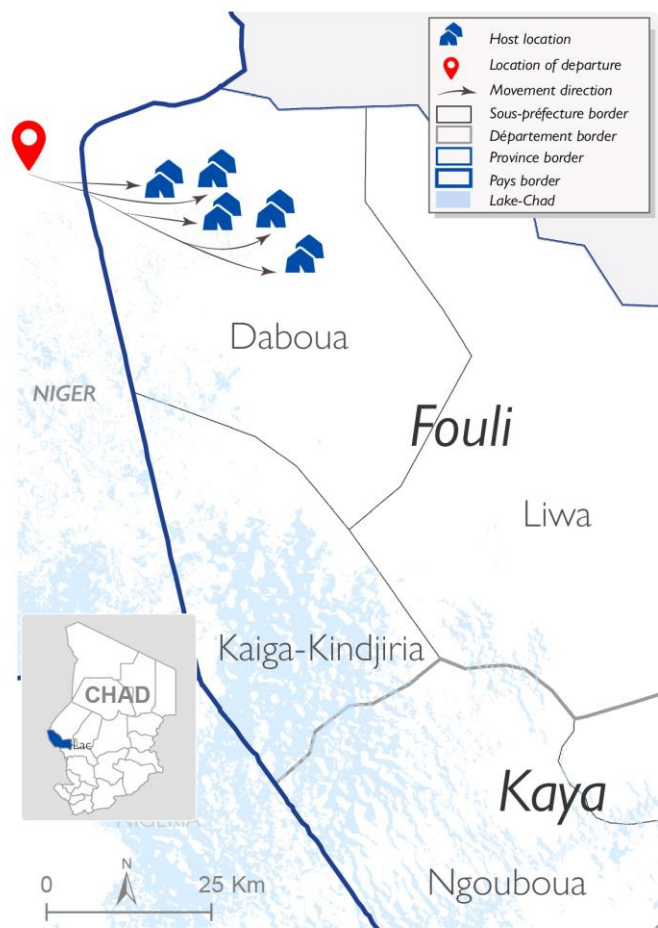

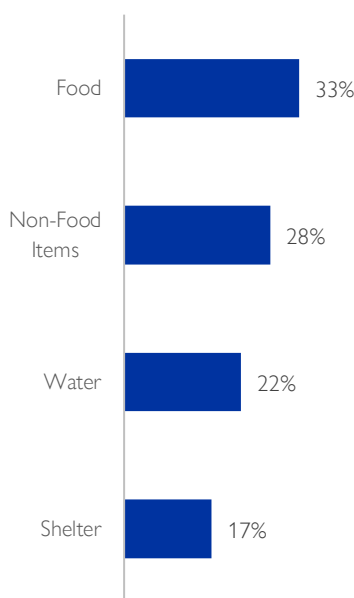
6 Movements

The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is to collect information on large and sudden population movements as well as on security and climate emergencies. Information is collected through key informant interviews or direct observation. This dashboard presents information on Chadian refugee movements from N'guiguimi sous-préfecture (Niger) to Daboua during the period from August to October 2023.

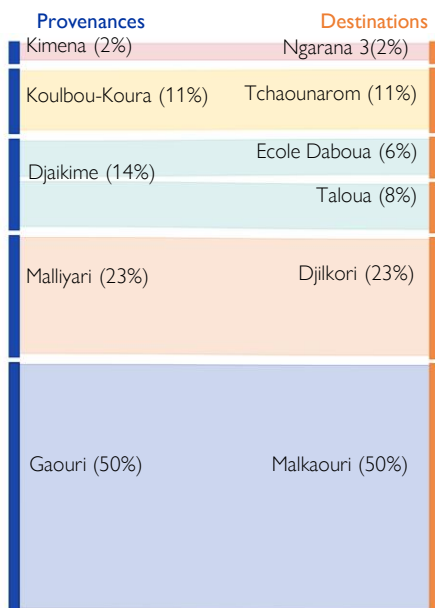
- Following an increased number of kidnappings in Djaikimé, Malliyari, Koulbou-Koura, Gaouri and Kimena localities (sous-préfecture of N'guiguimi), **497 households** of Chadian refugees (**2,565 individuals**) left these localities and sought refuge in **Daboua Ecole, Djilkori, Tchaounarom, Malkaouri and Taloua sites**, situated in the sous-préfecture of Daboua.
- Following /attacks perpetrated by armed groups in October near the village of Kimena, **20 households (50 individuals)**, preventively left this village (N'guiguimi sous-préfecture) and took refuge on October 9th, 2023, in Ngarana 3 site (sous-préfecture of Daboua).
