

Flow Monitoring - Spontaneous Returns of Undocumented Afghans from Pakistan








In Torkham, 'Returning Home' is trending downwards, and 81% of the respondents cited this as a push factor (decrease of 11 percentage points compared to last week). 'Economic Factors' is trending upwards and is at 79% (increase of 15 percentage points compared to last week). 'Afraid of Being Deported' is trending upwards and 17% of the respondents cited this as a push factor (increase of 8 percentage points compared to last week). 'Lack of Documentation' is also trending upwards and is at 11% (increase of 8 percentage points compared to last week). Whereas, 'Camp Closure' increased slightly and is at 6% (increase of 5 percentage points compared to last week).

In Chaman, 'Returning Home' is trending downwards, and 74% of the respondents cited this as a push factor (decrease of 3 percentage points compared to last week). 'Afraid of Being Deported' is trending upwards and is at 20% (increase of 6 percentage points compared to last week). 'Economic Factors' decreased slightly and is at 6% (decrease of 2 percentage points compared to last week). 'Lack of Documentation' increase and is at 5% (increase of 5 percentage points compared to last week). Whereas none of the respondents at Chaman cited 'Camp Closure' a push factor.


The indicator rated as the main pull factor for both border crossing points was 'Own Country'. For Torkham 97% of the respondents reported this as a key concern, whereas in Chaman, this was reported by 60% of the respondents. The second highest concern was 'Reunion with Family / Relatives' which was at 83% for Torkham and at 38% for Chaman.

Further in Torkham 14% of the respondents reported 'Availability of Assistance in Afghanistan' and 4% of the respondents reported 'Improvement in Security Situation' as a pull factor. Similarly in Chaman, 2% of the respondents reported 'Availability of Assistance in Afghanistan' and none of the respondents reported 'Improvement in Security Situation' as a pull factor.


Population Movement Trend for Spontaneous Returns of Undocumented Afghans from Pakistan



Overall 82% of Undocumented Afghan returnees from this week lived in rented houses, followed by 13% in camps, whereas the remaining 5% comprise of families that lived in a spontaneous settlement or in a closed Camp.

There are differences at the provincial level, where for example in Sindh 100%, in Punjab 96% and Balochistan 93% of undocumented Afghan families lived in a rented house whereas only 73% of the families in KPK lived in a rented house.

It was observed that in KPK 19%, of Undocumented Afghan families lived in a camp followed by 7% in Balochistan, and none in Punjab or Sindh.
