

Affected Population:



Between 23 and 25 October 2023, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 3,689 households (22,134 individuals) displaced due to Cyclone Tej which made landfall in Al Maharah governorate on 22 October.

Most people moved into/within the following governorates and districts:

- Al Maharah (3,384 HHs) – Haswin (1,815 HHs), Al Ghaydhah (1,123 HHs), Al Masilah (210 HHs) districts. All displacements in the governorate were internal.
- Hadramawt (305 HHs) – Ar Raydah wa Qussayar (305 HHs) district. All displacements in the governorate were internal.

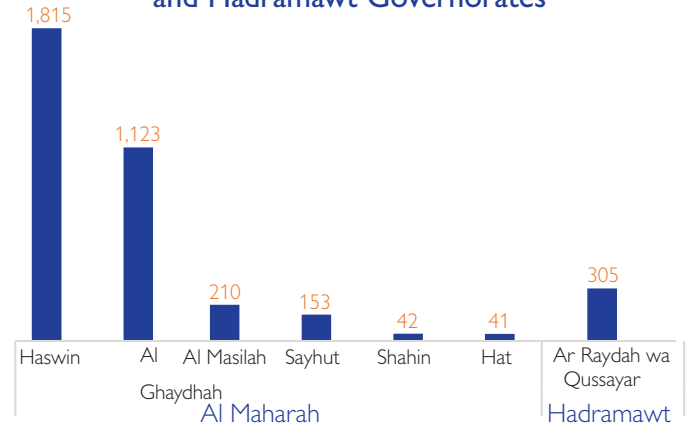
The cyclone brought heavy rains and strong winds, which caused flooding and damage to infrastructure.

This unfortunate natural disaster has prompted a significant need for humanitarian response and support in the affected area.

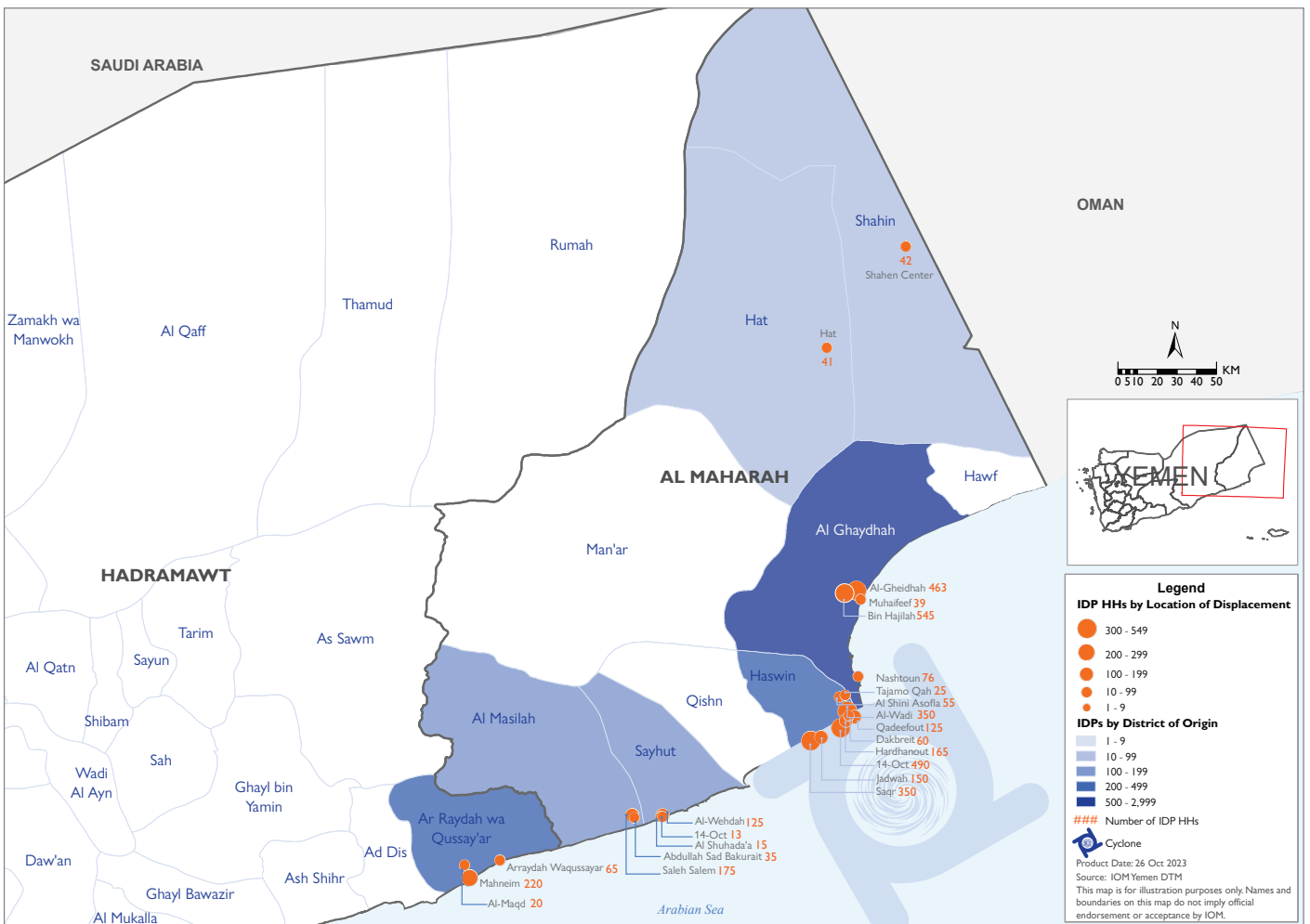
Main Needs:

NFI According to IOM's Rapid Displacement Tracking (RDT), 2,901 households, which accounts for approximately 79 per cent of the total displaced households, primarily need non-food items. Non-food items typically include essential supplies such as shelter materials, blankets, clothing, hygiene kits, and other items necessary for daily living and basic comfort.

The data indicates that 788 households, constituting roughly 21 per cent of the tracked households, primarily require food assistance. Food assistance typically involves providing access to nutritious food, either through distribution of food supplies or through other means such as food vouchers or cash transfers, to ensure that the basic nutritional needs of the affected households are met.
