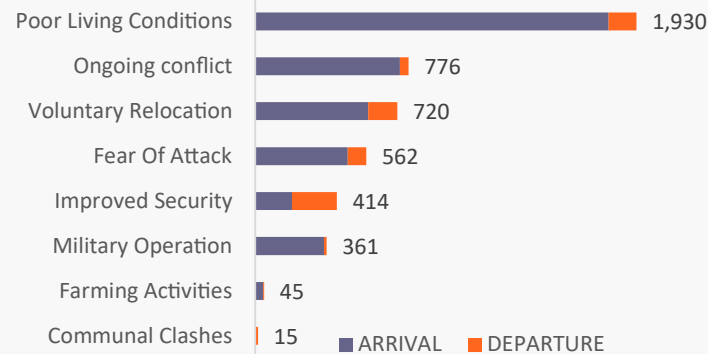
### New Arrival Screening by Nutrition Partners



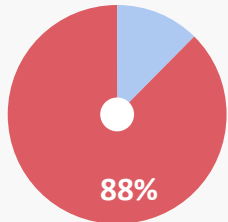
Within the period of 18 – 23 July 2018, a total of 4,823 movements were recorded, including 4,138 arrivals and 685 departures at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Konduga, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Adamawa and Borno States.

Assessments identified the following main triggers of movements: poor living conditions (40%), ongoing conflict (16%), voluntary relocation (15%), fear of attacks/communal clashes (12%), improved security (9%), military operations (7%) and farming activities (1%).

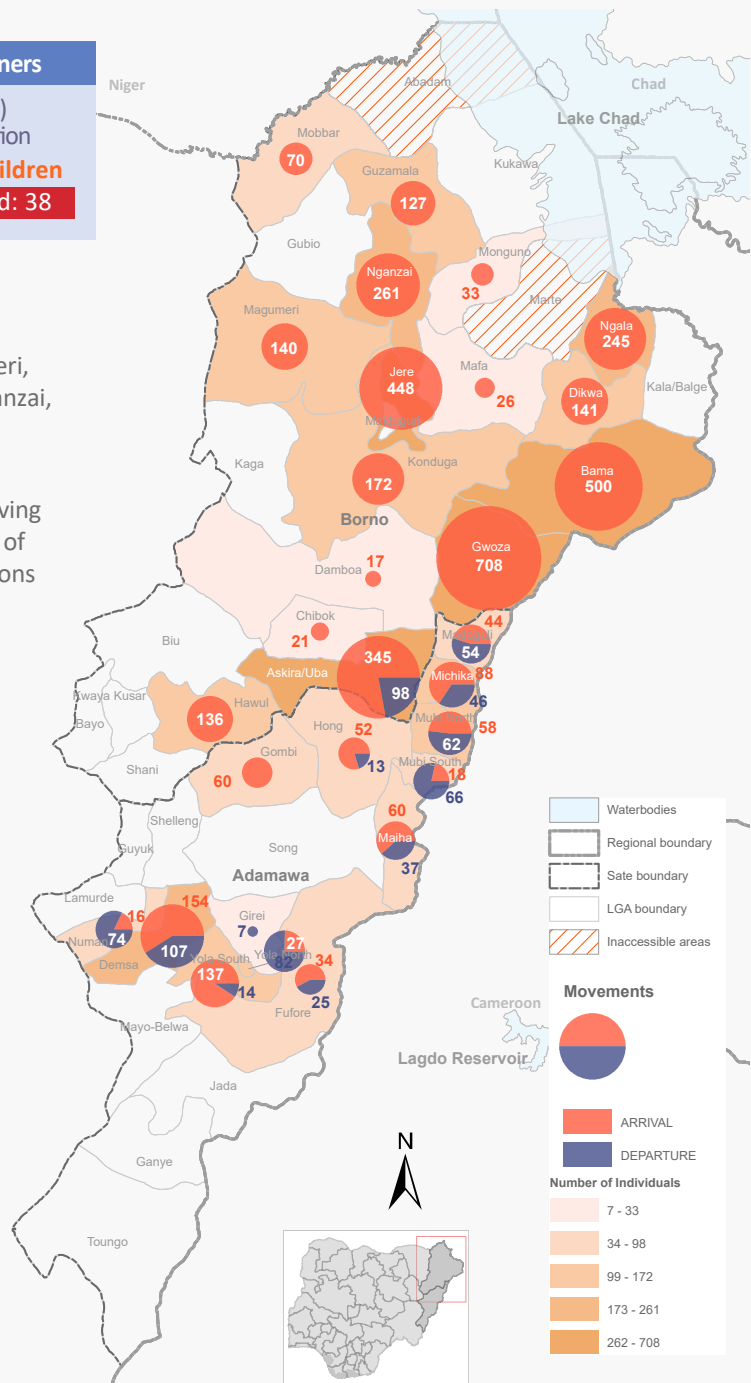
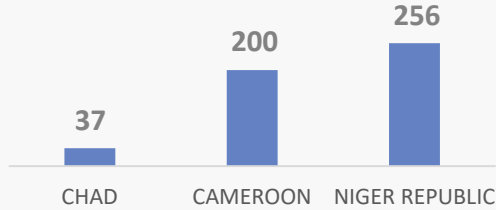
### Number of individuals by movement triggers

### Summary of major movements

**GWOZA:** 708 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno State. These include 519 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 176 arrivals at GSS Camp and 13 individuals who arrived at Wakane ward of Gwoza LGA. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions, military operations and voluntary relocation.

**BAMA:** 500 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. These include 331 arrivals at GSSSS Camp in Shehuri ward and 169 arrivals at Banki Camp from surrounding wards. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions and voluntary relocation.

**JERE:** 448 arrivals were recorded at Jere LGA of Borno State. These include 325 arrivals at Dalori ward of Jere from Fufore LGA in Adamawa and 123 arrivals at Old-Maiduguri ward of Jere from Marte LGA. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions and ongoing conflict.

**ASKIRA/UBA:** 345 arrivals and 98 departures were recorded at Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. These include 261 arrivals at Wamdeo ward of Askira/Uba from Kopa/Multhafu ward due to ongoing conflict in the area, 51 arrivals from Hawul LGA, 18 arrivals from Taraba State, 3 arrivals from Nasarawa State and 98 individuals who left Askira/Uba for surrounding LGAs due ongoing conflict and poor living conditions.

## New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid upper-arm circumference (MUAC) measurement and signs of Oedema was conducted by Sector partners for 378 children of 0-59 months.

The MUAC reading for 378 children screened was: 38 children (25 from inaccessible and 13 from accessible area) were in the Red category, 71 were in the Yellow category and 269 were found to be in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in any of the 7 LGAs.

The results also include 23 children from neighbouring countries out of which 20 children were in the Green category, two in the Yellow category and only one in the Red category. All children found with severe acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
