

OVERVIEW

The Registered IDP Area Baseline Assessment provides granular data on the number and geographic location of officially registered internally displaced people (IDPs) who have displaced since February 2022, as recorded and reported by local authorities across Ukraine. This report assesses registered IDP presence at the raion level, also mapping the recorded change since the previous round. Round 29 presents the data of the recorded registered IDP population disaggregated by sex, age and state-recognised disability status.

The data collected for the Area Baseline Assessment Round 29 reflects the up-to-date local administrative register of the IDP population as of 31 October 2023, equivalent to a total of 3,527,731 registered IDPs recorded. Registered IDP figures were collected for 1,039 hromadas (78% of all hromadas covered in Ukrainian government-controlled areas). Data disaggregated by age, sex and disability status were provided for around 78 per cent of the administrative units covered.


For this assessment, IOM define IDPs as persons who are officially registered as having fled their habitual place of residence due to the current war in Ukraine.


KEY FINDINGS

- Among oblasts, **Dnipropetrovska** (390,682), **Kharkivska** (348,040) and **Kyivska** (335,014) have the highest numbers of recorded officially registered IDPs.
- At the raion level, **Kyivska** (283,389), **Kharkivskiyi** (180,506), and **Dniprovskiyi** (167,899) host the highest numbers of registered IDPs.
- **Kharkivska** (29%) and **Donetska** (28%) Oblasts have the highest shares of recorded officially registered IDPs aged 60 and over.
- The total number of recorded officially registered IDPs in **conflict-affected areas** has increased in **Kharkivska**, **Donetska** and **Zaporizka** Oblasts, along the frontlines.
- Across the country, around **4 per cent** of recorded officially registered IDPs have a state-recognised disability status.

CHANGES IN REGISTERED IDP FIGURES

Changes in the caseload of recorded officially registered IDPs are measured controlling for variations in the area covered compared to the previous round. Map 2 below shows the changes in raions assessed between Rounds 28 and 29.


Consistent with previous trends, the number of recorded officially registered IDPs in the eastern and southern oblasts continues to grow. Significant increases were observed in Kharkivska (+5,401), Donetsk (+2,759), Odeska (+2,126), and Khersonska (+1,942) Oblasts. Kyiv City (+5,020) and Kyivska (+4,394) Oblast also recorded large increases in registered IDPs.

For Round 29, Kharkivska Oblast (+5,401) experienced the greatest increase in recorded officially registered IDP numbers. Notably, a high proportion of intra-oblast displacement movements were noted across Kharkivska, as IDPs moved from frontline areas towards safer regions following the destruction of housing. This increase might partly reflect the evacuation of civilians from heavily conflict-affected areas in Kupianskyi Raion, which was ordered by oblast authorities starting from 27 October. Among those displaced from evacuation locations, the vast majority (90%) seem to remain within Kharkivska Oblast, despite ongoing risks and exposure to conflict, including over three-quarters (78%) evacuated to Kharkiv City. Similarly, in Khersonska Oblast, displacement has increased as a result of the mandatory evacuations from 23 heavily conflict-affected locations in Khersonska Oblast, from 23 October. Despite the mandatory nature of the evacuations, relatively few households are evacuating: as of October 31, the date of the initial assessment,

IOM estimates that around 800 people had left their residence following the evacuation notice. Reportedly, many households are choosing to remain in their places of residence due to a combined fear of looting and family separation. Among those displaced from evacuation locations, over a quarter (27%) decided to remain in Khersonska Oblast, despite ongoing risks and exposure to hostilities, while a similar share of evacuees left for Dnipropetrovska (27%) and Mykolaivska (20%) Oblasts. Along the frontline in Donetsk Oblast, the local population continued to be displaced, with IDPs moving from settlements under the threat of nearing hostilities to safer areas located near IDPs' places of permanent residence. The decision to move to locations close to their place of origin, despite the high safety risks, suggests these movements might represent short-term displacement pending the improvement of safety conditions.

For the fourth month in a row, there was an outflow of displaced people from the central city of Kriviy Rih in Dnipropetrovska Oblast. This outflow was likely triggered by continued shelling in the region, alongside remaining limitations to the water supply, resulting from the Kakhovka dam destruction. At the same time, in the Nikopol region close to the frontline, there was a noted increase in the number of recorded officially registered IDPs. This increase can likely be attributed to the inflow of IDPs from the surrounding rural areas. Contrary to the previous round, a significant drop in the number of recorded officially registered IDPs was noted in Khmelnytska Oblast (-3,207). According to authorities, the primary driver can be attributed to the increase in rocket attacks over the past two months, believed to be targeting Khmelnytskyi nuclear power plant.


Map 2: Absolute change in registered IDPs per raion between Rounds 28 and Round 29



POPULATION DEMOGRAPHICS


Central and western oblasts have a higher proportion of recorded officially registered IDPs that are under 18 years of age in comparison to oblasts in the North and East. For example, in Zakarpatska (36%), Chernivetska (35%), Lvivska (31%), Vinnytska (31%), and Ivano-Frankivska (31%) Oblasts located in the West, the share of minors among registered IDPs is above the national average. In contrast, Kharkivska (29%) and Donetsk (28%) Oblasts in the East observe a relatively high proportion of recorded officially registered IDPs aged 60 and over. Moreover, the proportion

of female IDPs in all western oblasts is significantly higher than the rest of the country, with Ivano-Frankivska (66%) and Zakarpatska (65%) Oblasts having the highest shares. Conversely, in southern and eastern oblasts, the proportion of male IDPs is higher than in the rest of the country, and are highest in Khersonska (47%) and Zaporizka (44%) Oblasts. Overall, these trends seem to indicate that displaced women and children tend to register as IDPs further away from the areas affected by the war, while male and older IDPs tend to remain closer to their habitual place of residence.

METHODOLOGY

Data for the Area Baseline Assessment is collected through a network of Key Informants within the local oblast administration bodies across the country. Every month, IOM collects the recorded figures on registered displacement directly from the regional authorities, as well as sex, age and disability disaggregated estimates among the registered IDP population. In addition, IOM collects feedback from local authorities to explain changes across rounds and to provide interpretation for the trends observed.

In line with the established Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) approach, IOM endeavors to regularly collect data on the recorded officially registered IDP population in all territories under the control of the Government of Ukraine. While data collection capacity grows, geographical coverage can change across rounds.

The figures provided in this report reflect the recorded registered IDP population, and as such do not include displaced individuals who have not officially registered with the local authorities. For further information on broader displacement figures and trends, see the IOM General Population Survey.


DISCLAIMERS

Information on disability status as conveyed in this report does not reflect international standards guidelines for the inclusion of persons with disabilities but does reflect disability status as recognized by the Government of Ukraine.

The data in this report was sourced locally from oblast authorities and their official IDP registration data per oblast, raion, and hromada, where available. As such, it likely represents an undercount of those who have been de facto forced to flee their homes.


