The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is to collect information on large and sudden population movements as well as on security and climate emergencies. Information is collected through key informant interviews or direct observation. This dashboard presents information on a movement which occurred on **7 November 2023** in the town of **Ounianga-Kébir**, located in the province of Ennedi Ouest, near the Libyan border.


On November 5th, 2023, **28 Chadian nationals** (26 men, 2 women) were collectively expelled from Libya and arrived in the town of Ounianga-Kébir on 7 November 2023. Most of the expelled persons come from Guéra, Wadi Fira, Ouaddaï and Batha. They reported having spent between one and seven months in Libyan prisons in Benghazi, Djidabya and Kouffra before being expelled.

As such, an assessment was carried out in Ounianga-Kébir on 8 November 2023 by an IOM team in order to register these expelled individuals.

During the same day, they received **food, non-food items (mainly blankets and mats), health care and transport to their places of origin.**
