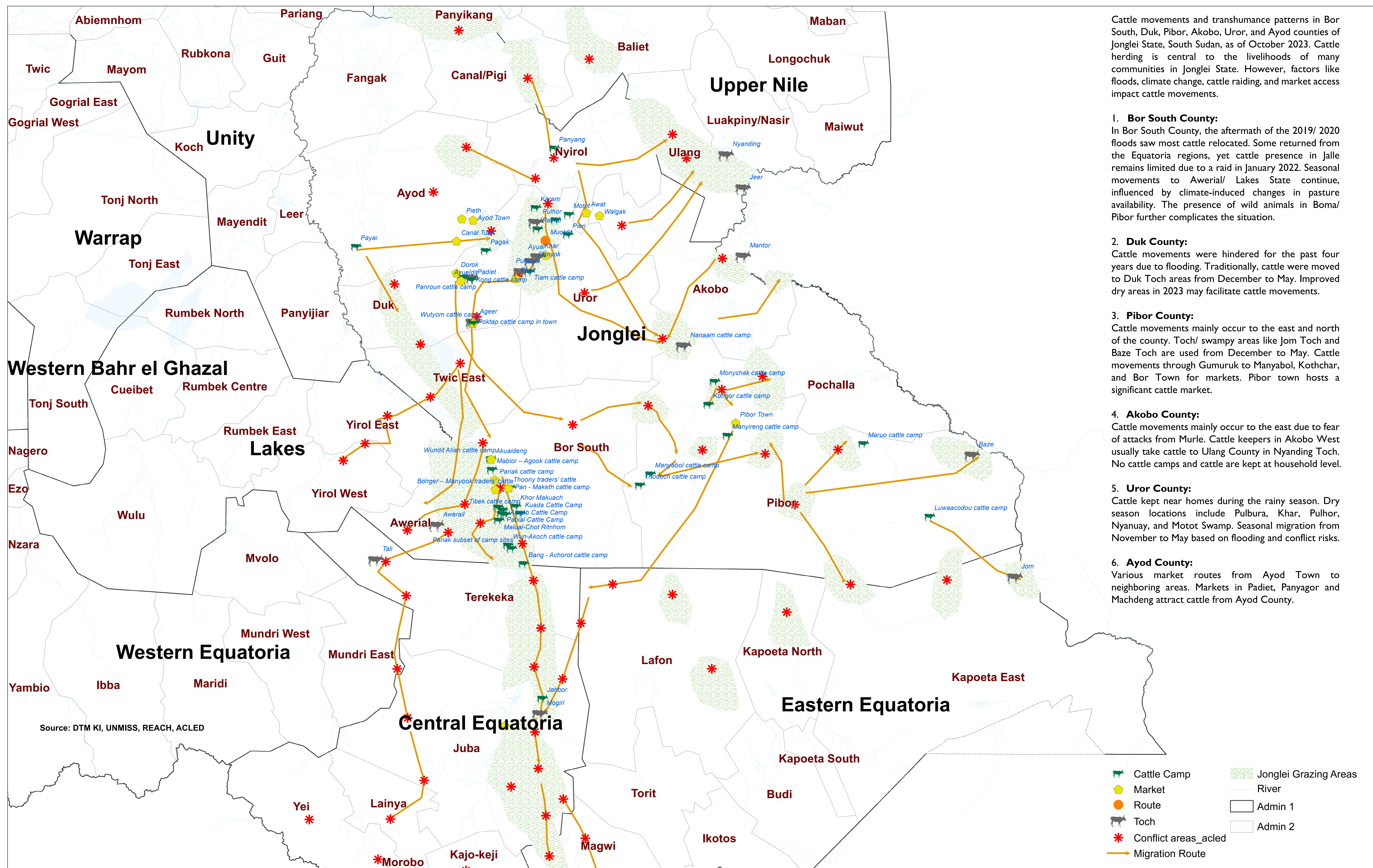












South Sudan - Jonglei Cattle Migration Outlook 2023-2024



Cattle movements and transhumance patterns in Bor South, Duk, Pibor, Akobo, Uror, and Ayod counties of Jonglei State, South Sudan, as of October 2023. Cattle herding is central to the livelihoods of many communities in Jonglei State. However, factors like floods, climate change, cattle raiding, and market access impact cattle movements.

- Bor South County:**
In Bor South County, the aftermath of the 2019/ 2020 floods saw most cattle relocated. Some returned from the Equatoria regions, yet cattle presence in Jalle remains limited due to a raid in January 2022. Seasonal movements to Awerial/ Lakes State continue, influenced by climate-induced changes in pasture availability. The presence of wild animals in Boma/ Pibor further complicates the situation.
- Duk County:**
Cattle movements were hindered for the past four years due to flooding. Traditionally, cattle were moved to Duk Toch areas from December to May. Improved dry areas in 2023 may facilitate cattle movements.
- Pibor County:**
Cattle movements mainly occur to the east and north of the county. Toch/ swampy areas like Jom Toch and Baze Toch are used from December to May. Cattle movements through Gumuruk to Manyabol, Kothchar, and Bor Town for markets. Pibor town hosts a significant cattle market.
- Akobo County:**
Cattle movements mainly occur to the east due to fear of attacks from Murle. Cattle keepers in Akobo West usually take cattle to Ulang County in Nyanding Toch. No cattle camps and cattle are kept at household level.
- Uror County:**
Cattle kept near homes during the rainy season. Dry season locations include Pulbura, Khar, Pulhor, Nyanuay, and Motot Swamp. Seasonal migration from November to May based on flooding and conflict risks.
- Ayod County:**
Various market routes from Ayod Town to neighboring areas. Markets in Padiet, Panyagor and Machdeng attract cattle from Ayod County.
