


### New Arrival Screening by Nutrition Partners




Within the period of 24 – 31 July 2018, a total of 6,354 movements were recorded, including 5,562 arrivals and 792 departures at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Kala/Balge, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Adamawa and Borno States.

Assessments identified the following main triggers of movements: voluntary relocation (30%), ongoing conflict (27%), poor living conditions (26%), fear of attacks/communal clashes (9%), improved security (5%), military operations (3%).


### Number of individuals by movement triggers

### Summary of major movements

**BAMA:** 1,046 arrivals and 540 departures were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. These include 712 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from Dara Jamal (350 individuals), Soye (89 individuals), Banki (173 individuals) and Abbaram (100 individuals) wards of Bama LGA due to poor living conditions; 334 arrivals at Banki Camp from Kumshe (215 individuals) and Buduwa (119 individuals) wards of Bama LGA; and 540 individuals who were assisted by the Nigerian government to leave Banki Camp in order to return to their various places of origin in Bama, Maiduguri and Jere LGAs of Borno State.

**NGANZAI:** 1,265 fled Damaram ward of Nganzai LGA for Gajiram ward due to ongoing conflict in the area.

**GWOZA:** 847 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno State. These include 654 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 177 arrivals at GSS Camp and 16 arrivals at GSSSS Camp. The movements were due to poor living conditions in surrounding areas of Gwoza and Bama LGAs.

**ASKIRA/UBA:** 373 arrivals and 8 departures were recorded at Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. These include 294 arrivals at Kopa/Multhafu ward from surrounding villages due to fear of attack, 37 arrivals at Mussa ward, 27 arrivals at Ngohi ward, 10 arrivals at Uba ward, 5 arrivals at Wamdeo ward and 8 departures for Hong LGA. The main movement trigger include fear of attack, poor living conditions and voluntary relocation.

**MAGUMERI:** 175 arrivals were recorded at Gajiganna 1 ward of Magumeri LGA from Damaram (148 individuals) and Alarge (27 individuals) wards of Nganzai LGA due to ongoing conflict in the areas.

## New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid upper arm circumference (MUAC) measurement and signs of Oedema was conducted by Sector partners for 678 children of 6-59 months.

Of the 678 children screened, the MUAC reading for 70 children (62 from inaccessible and 8 from accessible area) was in the Red category, the reading for 121 children was in the Yellow category and 487 had readings measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in any of the seven LGAs that were covered.

The results also include 79 children from neighbouring countries (52 who arrived at Mobbar LGA and 27 at Ngala LGA) who were screened, out of which 61 children were in the Green category,

12 in the Yellow category and 6 children were in the Red category. All children found with severe acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
