The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is to collect information on large and sudden population movements as well as on security and climate emergencies. Information is collected through key informant interviews or direct observation. This dashboard presents information on a movement which occurred on **6 December 2023** in the town of **Ounianga-Kébir**, situated in the province of **Ennedi Ouest**, near the Libyan border.


On December 1st, 2023, **150 Chadian nationals** (among them, ten minors, eight elderly persons, and two persons living with physical disabilities) were collectively expelled from Libya and arrived in the town of Ounianga-Kébir on 6 December 2023. Additionally, these individuals reported having spent between six months to two years in Libyan prisons in Tripoli, Adjabia, Benghazi and Koufra before being expelled.

The vast majority of expelled individuals come from Abéché, Bol and Amtiman.

From 9 to 10 December 2023, out of the 150 expelled individuals, 138 received **food, health care and transport to their place of origin** from the International Organization for Migration (IOM).
