



Within the period of 1-7 August 2018, a total of 6,494 movements were recorded, including 5,317 arrivals and 1,177 departures at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Kala/Balge, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Maiha, Mayo-Belwa, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Adamawa and Borno States.

Assessments identified the following main triggers of movements: ongoing conflict (45%), poor living conditions (24%), voluntary relocation (9%), improved security (7%), military operations (6%), involuntary relocation (4%), fear of attacks/communal clashes (4%), and farming activities (1%).





Summary of major movements

BAMA: 928 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. These include 571 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from Dara Jamal (224 individuals) and Soye (347 individuals) wards of Bama LGA due to poor living conditions; and 357 arrivals at Banki Camp from Cameroon (189 individuals) and Buduwa ward of Bama LGA (168 individuals).

MONGUNO: 827 arrivals were recorded in Monguno LGA of Borno State. These include 814 individuals who arrived at Water-Board Camp from Bunari village in Gowuram ward of Guzamala LGA, due to ongoing conflict in the area; and 13 individuals who arrived at GSSSS Camp from Niger Republic.

MAYO-BELWA: 791 arrivals were recorded in Mayo-Belwa LGA of Adamawa State. These include 326 arrivals at the town from surrounding villages, 257 arrivals at the town from Lau LGA of Taraba State and 208 arrivals at the town from Demsa LGA in Adamawa. All the movements were triggered by recent communal clashes with nomadic herdsmen in the area.

GUZAMALA: 770 individuals fled Bunari village in Gowuram ward of Guzamala LGA for Monguno LGA, due to recent conflict in the area and fear of insecurity.

GWOZA: 532 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno State. These include 307 arrivals at the Transit Camp and 225 arrivals at GSS Camp. The movements were mainly due to poor living conditions in the areas.

New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) measurement and signs of Oedema was conducted by Sector partners for 588 children of 6-59 months. Of the 588 children screened, the MUAC reading for 144 children (137 from inaccessible and 7 from accessible area) was in the Red category, the reading for 115 children was in the Yellow category and 329 had readings measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in any of the eight LGAs that were covered.

The results also include 48 children from neighbouring regions (28 who arrived at Bama, 18 at Mobbar and 2 in Ngala LGAs); out of which 34 children were in the Green category, 7 in Yellow
