





Within the period of 8 – 14 August 2018, a total of 4,675 movements were recorded, including 4,269 arrivals and 406 departures at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Gubio, Guzamala, Gwoza, Hawul, Hong, Jere, Kaga, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Maiha, Mayo-Belwa, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Adamawa and Borno States.

Assessments identified the following main triggers of movements: ongoing conflict (34%), poor living conditions (30%), voluntary relocation (12%), improved security (11%), military operations (9%) and fear of attacks/communal clashes (4%).

Summary of major movements

MONGUNO: 706 persons fleeing from Jigalti ward of Nganzai LGA due to recent conflict in the area arrived at Monguno LGA of Borno State. Of the 706 arrivals recorded, 75 arrived at Vertinary Camp, 95 at Fulatari village and 536 were at Water-Board. Urgent needs include food, shelter and NFIs.

BAMA: 671 arrivals and 3 departures were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. These include 478 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from Soye ward of Bama, 193 arrivals at Banki Camp from Kumshe/Kotembe wards and 3 individuals who left GSSSS Camp for Alau ward of Konduga LGA.

NGANZAI: 414 arrivals were recorded in Nganzai LGA of Borno State. These include 194 individuals who arrived at the New Arrival Reception Center in Bakkasi, 132 arrivals at Bukarti Camp in Gajiram ward and 88 arrivals at Nganzai ward of Nganzai LGA. The movements were due to ongoing conflict at Sabsabwa, Damaram and Jigalta wards of Nganzai LGA.

GWOZA: 403 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno State. These include 255 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka and 148 arrivals at GSS. The movements were mainly due to poor living conditions in the areas.

DIKWA: 397 individuals arrived at the FOB Screening Center in Dikwa from surrounding wards including, Warshale, Muliye, Walassa and Nguduram ward. The movements were due to ongoing military operations in Dikwa.

New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and signs of Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 351 children. Of the 351 children screened, the MUAC reading was for 106 children (104 from inaccessible and 2 from accessible area) was in the Red category, the reading for 60 children was in the Yellow category and 185 had readings in the Green category.

The results also include 27 children from neighbouring countries (9 who arrived at Gwoza, 14 at Mobbar and 4 at Ngala LGAs); out of which 25 children are in the Green category, 2 in Yellow and none was in the Red category. All children found with severe acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
