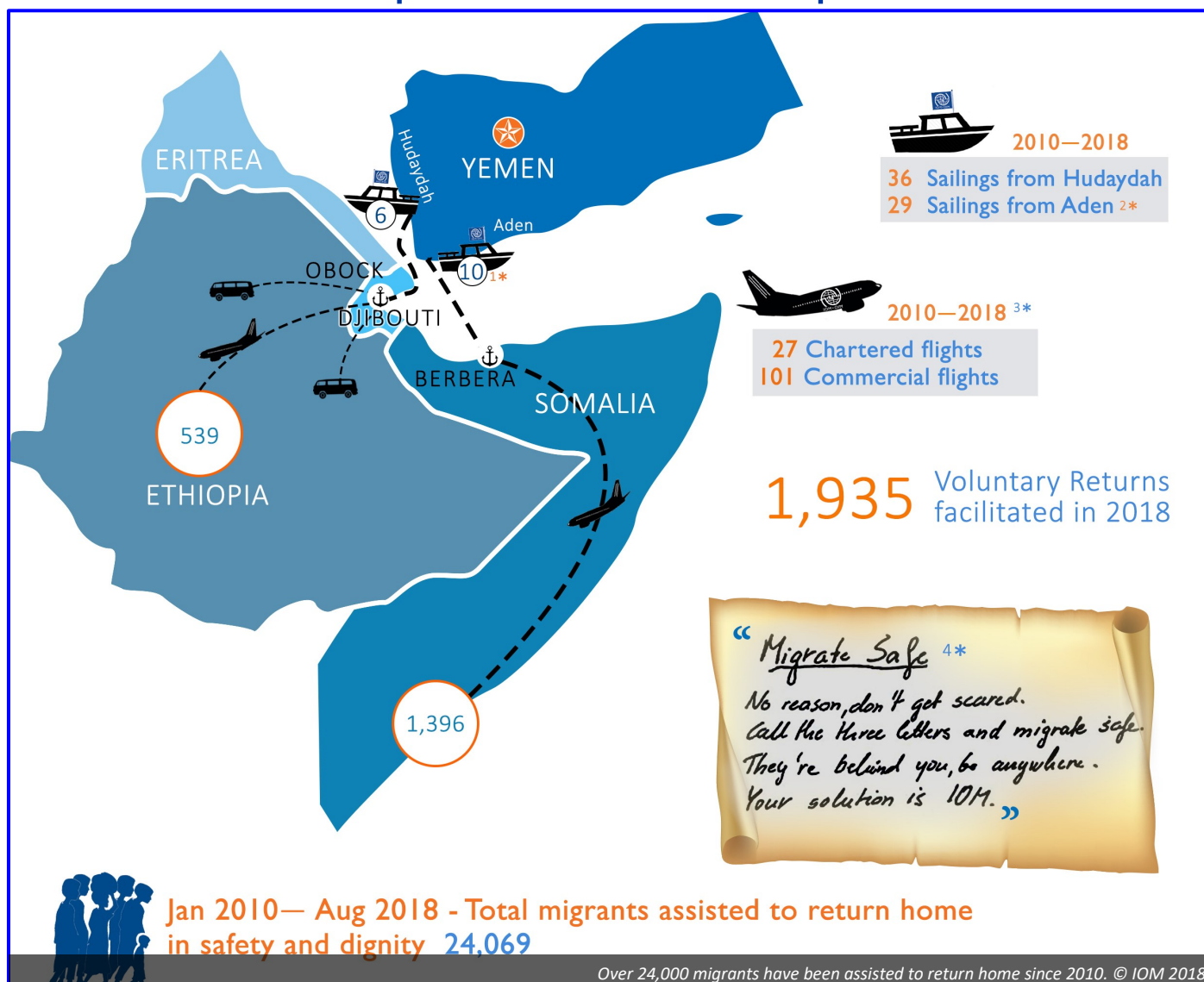

Hudaydah Crisis

Situation

The situation in Hudaydah remains precarious, with airstrikes, heavy shelling, and armed clashes reported in the Hudaydah city and other districts including Hays, Ad-Durayhimi, At-Tuhayat, Al-Hawak, and Bayt Al-Faqih. Lacking funds to travel or fearing further hardship in areas of displacement, many civilians are reportedly trapped in areas where fighting is ongoing. Fighting has also disrupted markets and the movement of traders, prompting some markets to close. Over 64,800 displaced households from Hudaydah Governorate have been identified since June 2018, with 21,000 households remaining within Hudaydah and the rest dispersing to other Governorates.

IOM Response

- ✓ Supporting IDPs in 8 schools with hot meals and distribution of non-food items. Through these kitchens and other facilities, over 56,900 hot meals have been served since the current crisis began.
- ✓ Provided medical consultation to 8,474 individuals, antenatal care to 986 pregnant women, reproductive health consultations to 1,233 individuals, MHPSS services to 834 individuals, and conducted health promotion activities among 3,318 individuals.
- ✓ Distributed Rapid Response Mechanism (RMM) kits – containing enough food rations for a family for a week, basic hygiene requirements and other essential items – among 3,385 displaced families.
- ✓ Provided multi-purpose cash assistance to 154 households upon verification.
- ✓ Providing transportation assistance to move IDPs to safer locations within or out of Hudaydah, and from Reception Centres in Sana'a to other locations (e.g. schools) in close collaboration with NAMCHA. A total of 1,096 individuals have been transported within Sana'a to date.
- ✓ Provided medical consultation to 1,465 individuals through the new clinic initiated at the Abu Bakr School and to 713 individuals through Abdul Qader Hilal health center, both in Sana'a, since July 2018.

Migrants Multi-sector Assistance

Migrants transiting Yemen are extremely vulnerable during every phase of the journey. IOM is providing lifesaving, multi-sectoral assistance to stranded migrants in Yemen, including providing an orderly, humane option to those who are willing to return to their country of origin.

A total of 1,505 migrants were provided direct assistance during the reporting week, including:

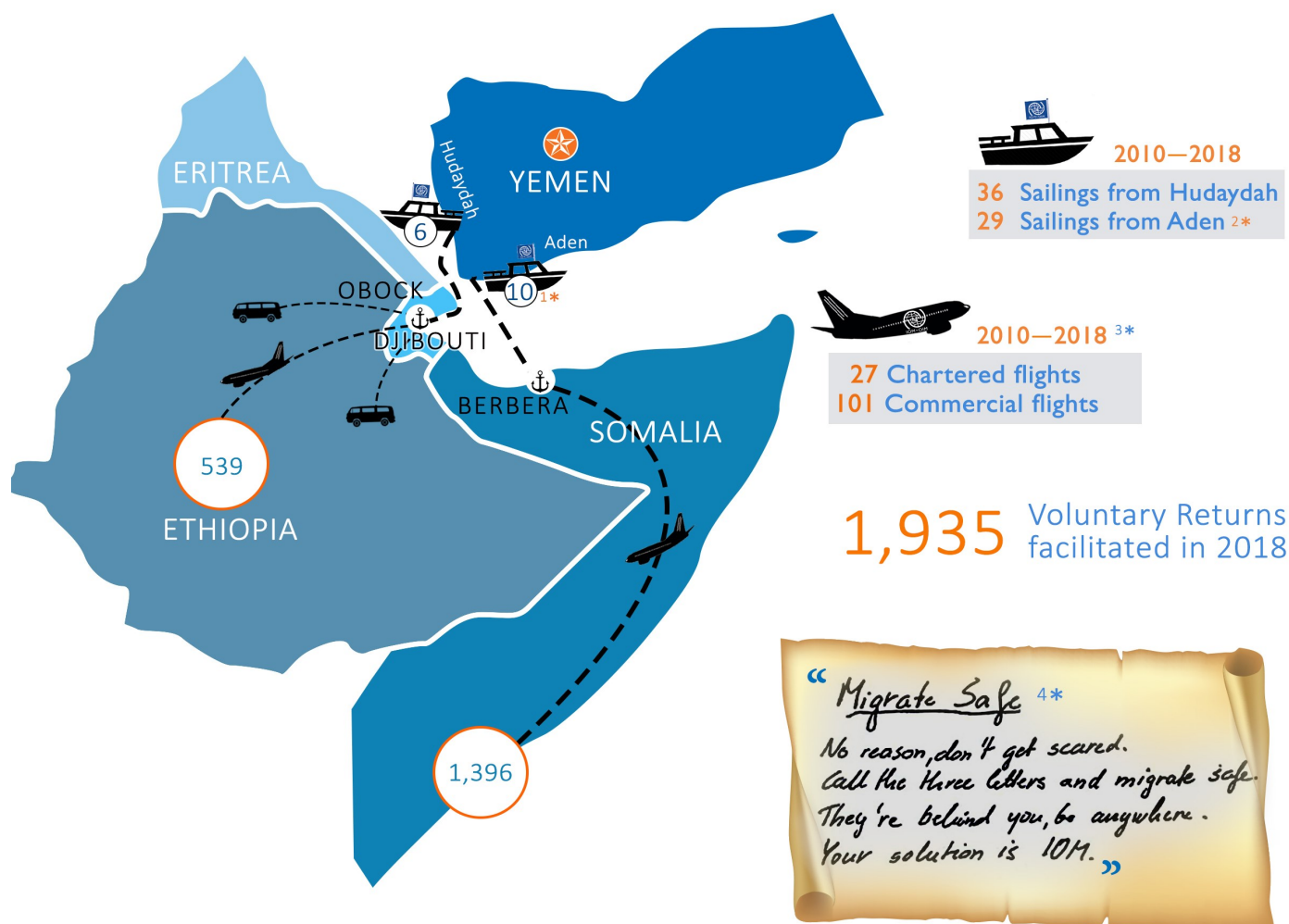
- ✓ 135 migrants registered and screened;
- ✓ 752 migrants provided with hot meals and snacks;
- ✓ 233 migrants provided with NFIs and hygiene kits;
- ✓ 44 migrants provided with temporary accommodation;
- ✓ 232 migrants provided with awareness raising orientation; and
- ✓ IOM's coastal search and rescue teams for migrants found 109 new arrivals and provided them with food, water, information, NFIs and medical assistance where necessary.

Regular Programming

Health

- ✓ A total of 8,037 (2,253 men, 2,375 women, 1,772 boys, and 1,637 girls) IDPs and other conflict-affected Yemenis and 267 migrants (194 men, 14 women, 57 boys, and 2 girls) were provided with healthcare assistance, including Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) and health promotion sessions.
- ✓ Provided MHPSS services to 1,650 children and their parents, conducted through individual and group sessions at the Child Friendly Spaces (CFS) in Sana'a, Amanat Al-Asimah, and Aden.
- ✓ The Middle East Response Initiative, implemented by IOM, supports national disease programmes to provide essential HIV, TB, and malaria services to key and vulnerable populations in Yemen, Iraq, Syria, Lebanon and Jordan. During the reporting week, IOM in Yemen supported the National Malaria Control Programme (NMCP) in preparatory work for the distribution of Long Lasting Insecticidal Nets (LLINs) in Amran, Hazza, and Abyan Governorates. Distribution of these LLINs will begin in September 2018, with over 400,000 LLINs to be distributed.
- ✓ Supported the NMCP to conduct onsite training on the National Anti-Malarial Drug (AMDs) Policy and Treatment Guidelines of severe Malaria cases. 28 laboratory technicians were trained on the microscopic diagnosis and 119 medical doctors and health workers including participants from Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences of Dhamar University attended the training seminars in 5 hospitals in Dhamar Governorate.
- ✓ 492 IDPs were tested using Rapid Diagnostic Tests and 3 Malaria positive cases were detected and enrolled in treatment regimens.

Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene

- ✓ Successfully completed repair of water sources and pipes, replacement of public toilets and supply/installation of UPVC pipes for sewers as well as construction of a mini-treatment plant for sanitation in Bayt Atef Allah and Bayt Naman water sites, benefiting over 3,700 IDPs and conflict-affected populations in Maswer district in Amran governorate.

Protection

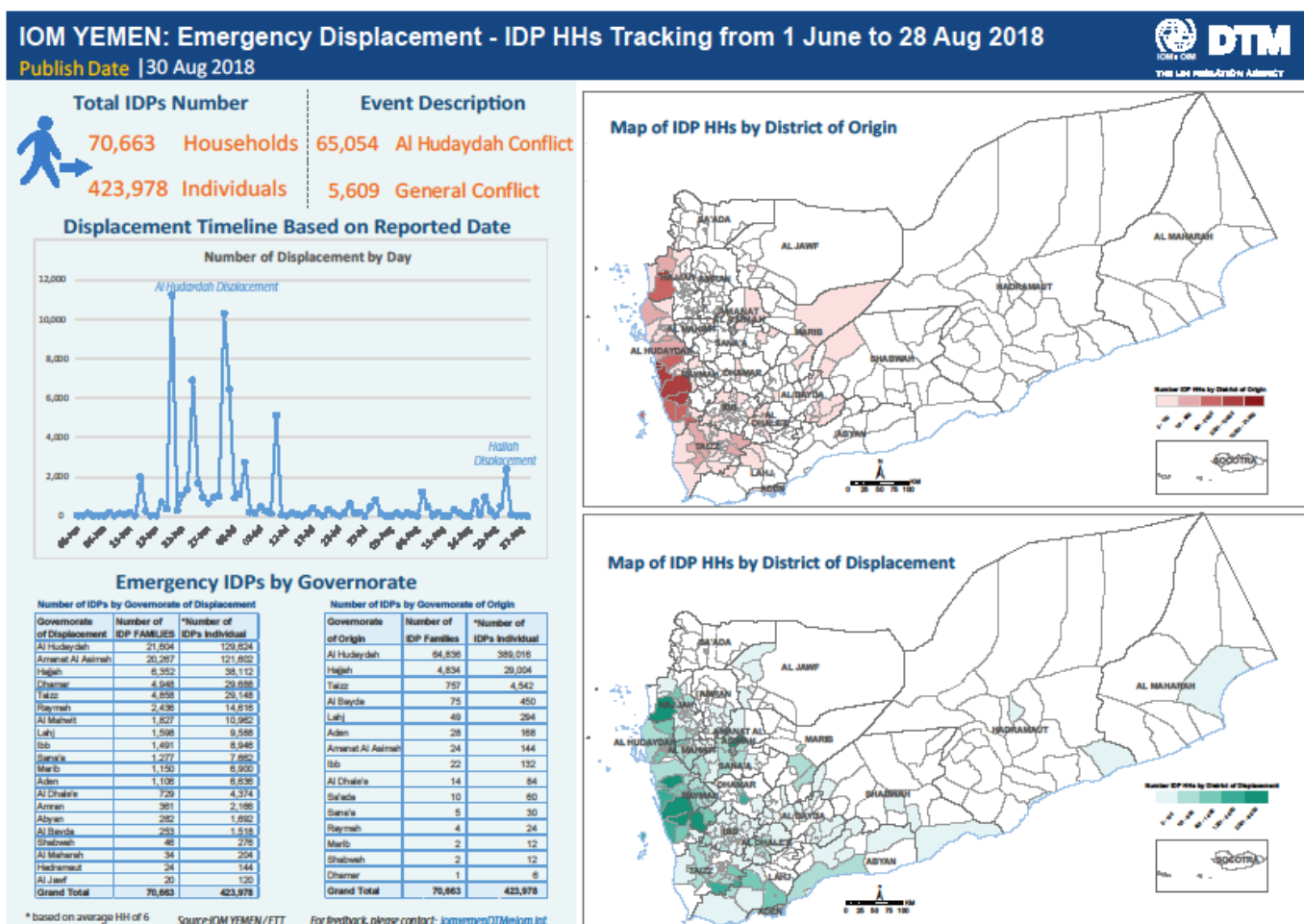
A total of 1,415 conflict-affected individuals (children and adults) benefitted from activities in Child Friendly Spaces (CFSs) in Sana'a and Aden. Among them, 7 children were provided with MHPSS services and all individuals (1,415) participated in awareness raising activities on various adolescence-relevant topics.

Movements and Needs Assessment

- ✓ IOM continues emergency tracking for IDPs displaced by the conflict across all southern governorates as well as in Taiz, Al Bayda and Al Hudaydah in the north.
- ✓ IOM continues Area Assessment in nine governorates of Yemen (Shabwa, Taiz, Al Mahrah, Aden, Socotra, Hadhramaut, Abyan, Al Dhale'e and Lahj).
- ✓ IOM continues Migrant Flow Monitoring activities across Yemen.
