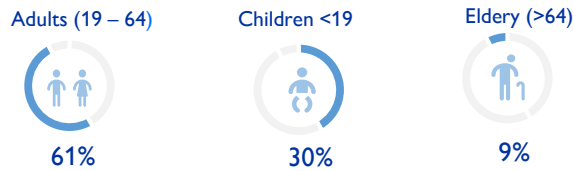
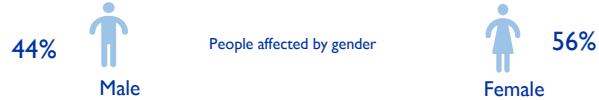




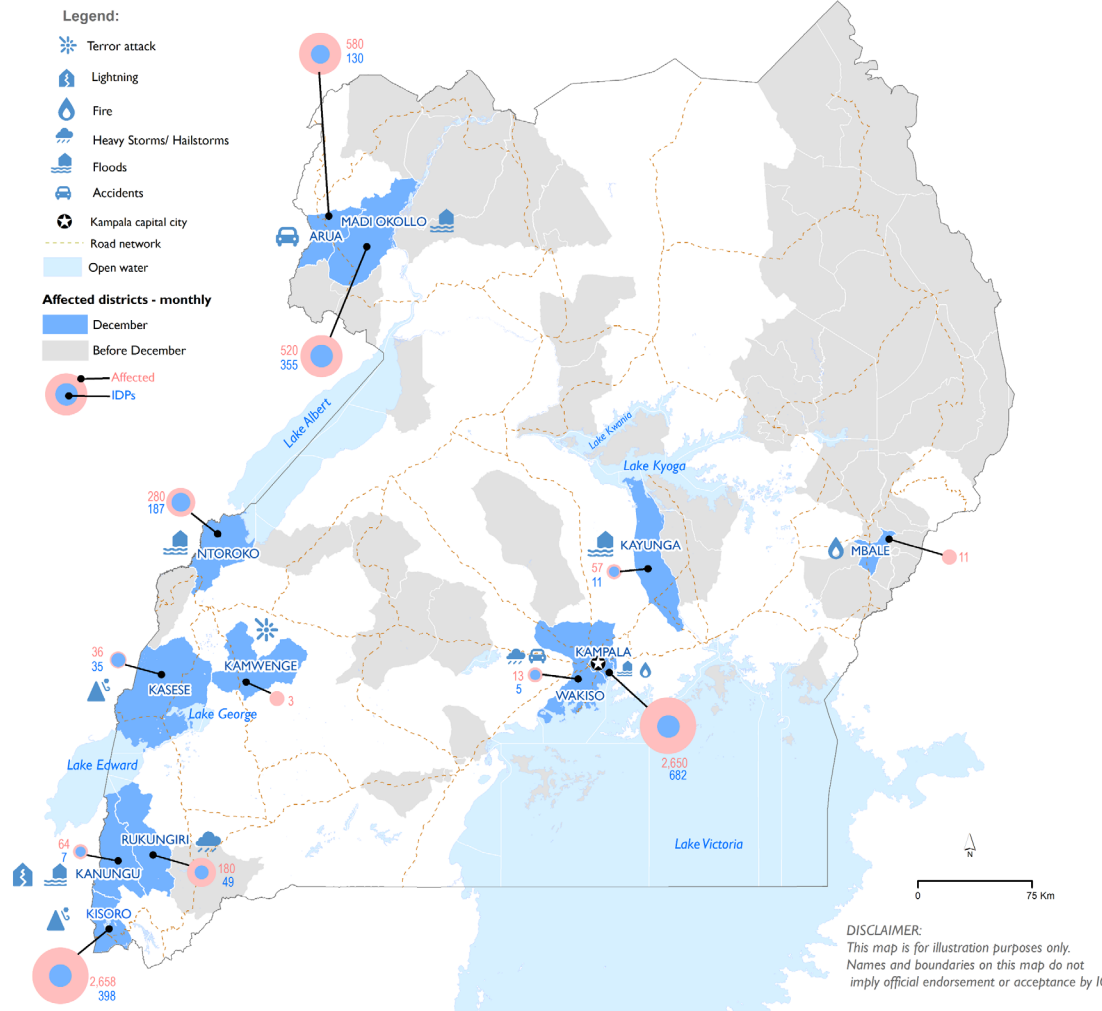
Overview of affected population – December 2023



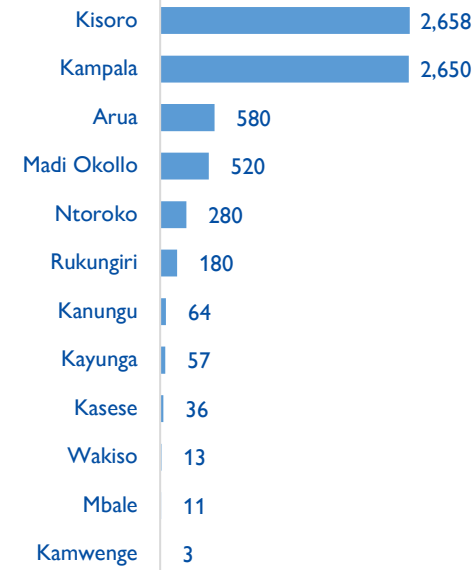
December 2023 observations

- Conclusion of the SONDR rainy season in Uganda, including landslides in Kisoro and Kasese, floods in Kampala, Kanungu, Kayunga, Ntoroko, and Madi Okollo, as well as storms in Rukungiri and Wakiso, have led to widespread disasters.
- The impact has been severe, affecting 7,052 individuals (1,618 households), with 1,869 people from 412 households internally displaced due to the adverse weather conditions.
- Adults between 19 and 64 years were the most affected age group (61%), followed by children below and equal to 18 (30%) and elderly above 64 (9%). Notably, more than half of affected people were female.
- Urgent needs have emerged, with Shelter, child protection, food assistance, and general protection identified as critical priorities in the aftermath of the disasters.
- Infrastructure damage is significant, with 233 houses partially damaged, 46 houses completely destroyed, and 71 water facilities, 4 health facilities, and 9 schools also adversely affected, underscoring the widespread impact on the community's well-being.

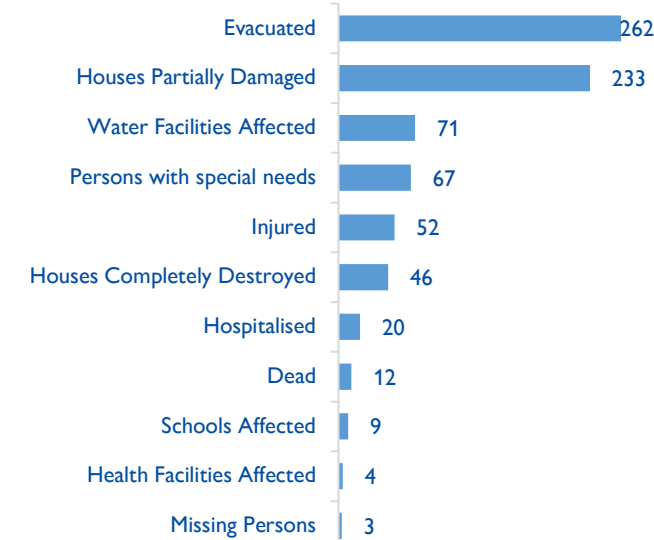
Districts affected in 2023

Disaster Impacts – December 2023



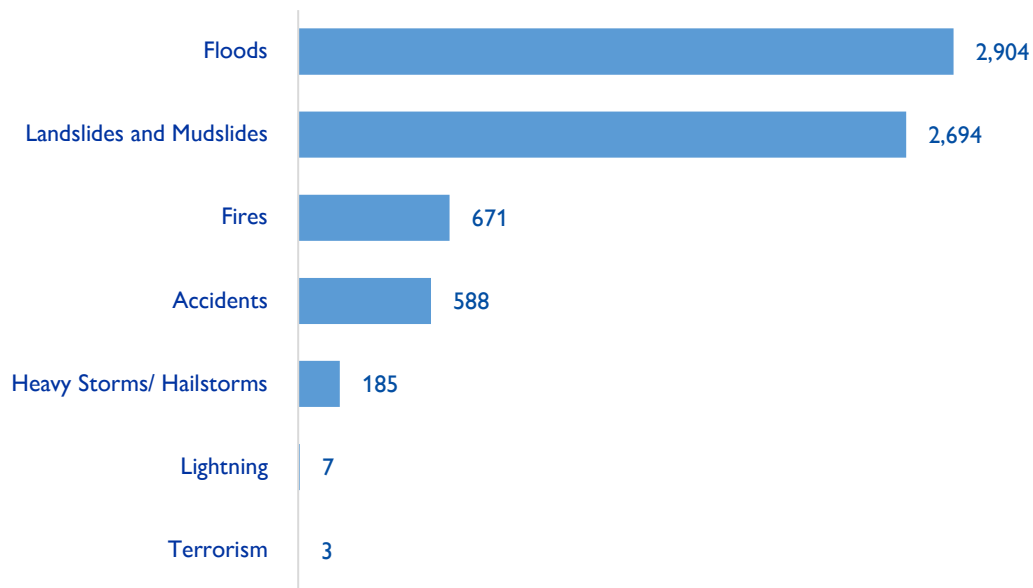

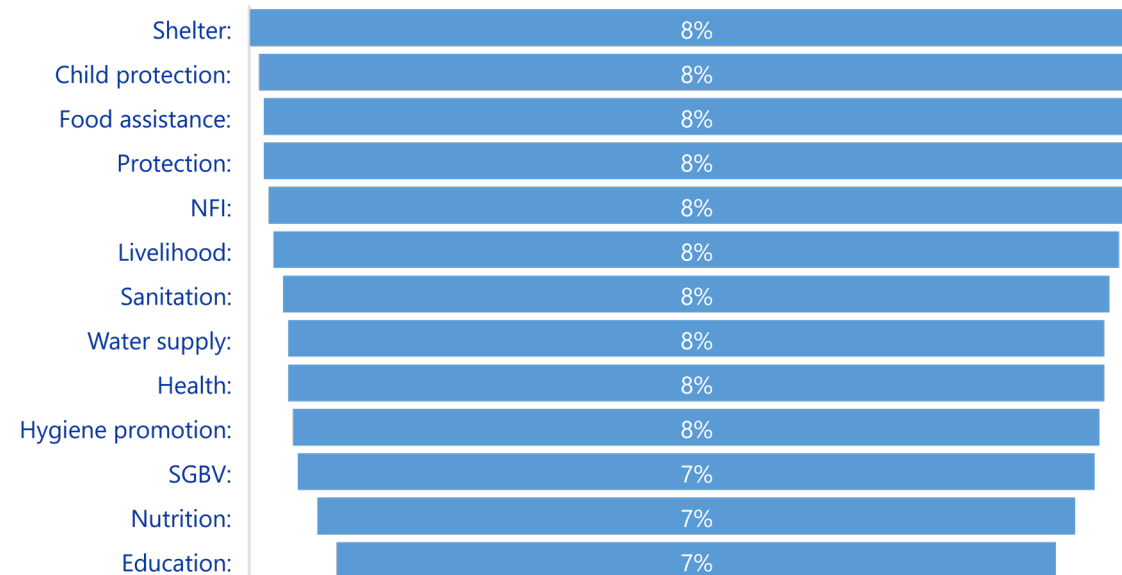

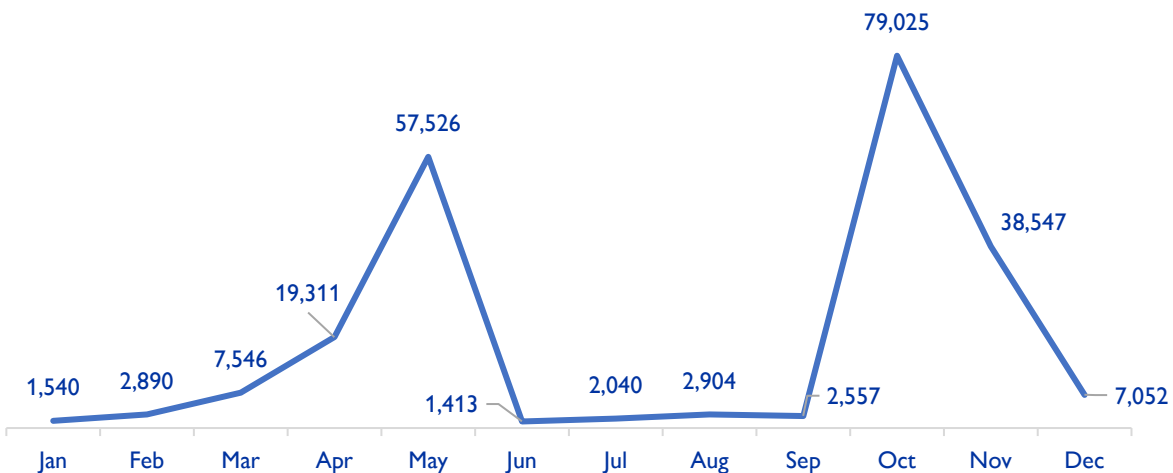
Number of affected people by disasters in December 2023
