



## METHODOLOGY

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a sub-component of the mobility tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilizes direct observations and a broad network of key informants to capture the best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.

## LIMITATIONS

The Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) figures reported are not cumulative of all the affected persons thus far, but rather provide a snapshot of the current displacement situation on the date indicated. The data and information reported on this dashboard are related solely to the movements caused by triggers on page two, between 01 - 07 January.

## TOP AREA OF ORIGIN





## ALERT SUMMARY


Between 01 and 07 January 2024, a total of 2,200 new arrivals were recorded at locations in Adamawa, Borno and Yobe states. The new arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Gwoza, Mafa, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected Borno State, in Demsa, Fufore, Ganye, Girei, Gombi, Guyuk, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Song, and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State and in Damaturu, Fune and Gujba LGAs of Yobe State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: poor living conditions (1,100 individuals or 50%), attacks (273 individuals or 12%), family re-unification (249 individuals or 11%), military operation (180 individuals or 8%), fear of attack (151 individuals or 7%), seasonal farming (87 individuals or 4%), improved security (86 individuals or 4%) and access to humanitarian support (74 individuals or 3%).


### PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS BY MOVEMENT TRIGGER




### NEEDS EVOLUTION\*

### MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY OF THE NEW ARRIVALS (CHILDREN 6 – 59 MONTHS)

Between 01 and 07 January 2024, an exhaustive nutrition screening using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 88 children of 6-59 months. Of the 88 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that two children were recorded in the red category, 10 children in the yellow category and 76 children in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the three LGAs assessed.

Among the 88 children screened, five arrived from neighbouring countries (5 in Ngala); of all the 5 children measured; four were in green, one was in yellow and none were in the red category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted to the treatment programme.
