

Emergency Tracking Tool | Movement Alert 92


Mecufi, Metuge, Macomia, and Mueda Districts, Cabo Delgado, Mozambique











Between 22 January to 01 of February 2024, a series of attacks in villages across Mecufi and Macomia, triggered the displacement 2,105. Of the total individuals displaced, 132 families with 426 individuals have taken refuge in displacement centers of Mueda (Imbuhu, Mpeme), 16 families with 74 individuals have taken refuge in displacement centers of Macomia (Nanga A and Nanga B), and 17 families with 61 individuals have taken refuge in displacement centers of Metuge (Mieze).

During this reporting period, cumulative displacements have been mapped across 4 districts. Please consider below graphs for movement flows at Posto level. Further locational-level data is also available from DTM teams.


- In summary, Mecufi reports an estimate of 247 families with 1,009 individuals (inclusive of 683 children) who have been displaced from Mancuia and Natuco and are currently in Sambane.
- In Macomia, 110 families with 525 individuals (inclusive of 316 children) have been displaced from Mienguevela, Chai, Mucojo and Pangane and are currently located in Nanga A, Nanga B and Xinavane.
- In Mueda, 132 families with 426 Individual (inclusive Children) have been displaced from Mocimboa da Praia (Diaca and Nango), are currently located in Mpeme, Imnuhu and Vila de Mueda.
- In Metuge, 48 families with 145 individuals (inclusive of 95 children) have been displaced from Chiure (Juravo) and Mecufi (Sambane), are currently located in Mieze.

Owing to prevailing security concerns in the region reported by displaced families, intentions on duration of their stay in current locations of displacement sites and host communities remains uncertain. Movements in the region continue to be dynamic within the districts. The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) - Movement Alert is to collect information on large and sudden population movements, providing humanitarian response partners with data on IDPs to support effective humanitarian response. Information is collected through key informants' interviews or direct observation. This alert provides basic information on displacements, and additional



Urgent needs are calculated by weighting the total number of IDP arrivals in each group against the stated priority


