


# EMERGENCY TRACKING TOOL (ETT)

### Movements




### New Arrival Screening by Nutrition Partners




Within the period of 19 – 25 September 2018, a total of 4,470 movements were recorded, including 3,756 arrivals and 714 departures. These movements occurred at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Chibok, Damboa, Dikwa, Gubio, Gwoza, Hawul, Konduga, Kukawa, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno state, and locations in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Mayo-Belwa, Michika, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Numan, Song, Yola-North and Yola-South LGAs of Adamawa state.

Assessments identified the following main triggers of movements: ongoing conflict (50%), poor living conditions (20%), voluntary relocation (13%), fear of attacks (9%), involuntary relocation (3%), flooding (3%) and improved security (2%)



### Number of individuals by movement triggers

### Summary of major movements

**NUMAN:** 1,841 arrivals and 69 departures were recorded at Numan LGA of Adamawa state. These include 1,841 arrivals at Numan II Primary School from Gamadio and Bolki wards of Numan LGA due to recent conflict in the area. Of the 1,841 individuals who arrived at Numan II Primary School, 69 left the location for Yola North and Mubi North LGAs out of fear of possible attack. Urgent needs include food, shelter and health support.

**GWOZA:** 364 arrivals were recorded at Gwoza LGA of Borno state. These include 355 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka and 9 arrivals at GSS Camp. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions, voluntary relocation and ongoing conflict.

**BAMA:** 258 arrivals and 101 departures were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno state. These include 223 arrivals at GSSSS Camp, 35 arrivals at Banki Camp and 101 individuals who left GSSSS Camp for the Transit Camp in Pulka. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions and voluntary relocation.

**MONGUNO:** 185 arrivals were recorded at Monguno LGA of Borno state. These were people fleeing from recent conflicts at Wamiri and Gudumbali wards of Guzamala LGA. Including 135 arrivals at the Reception Center in Bakkasi from Wamiri ward of Guzamala and 50 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from Gudumbali ward of Guzamala. Urgent needs include food, shelter and water.

**NGALA:** 127 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno state. These include 68 arrivals at Gamboru 'A' ward from Cameroon, 47 arrivals at International School Camp from Dikwa, and 12 arrivals at Arabic Camp from Lagos state. All the movements were voluntary.

## New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid upper arm circumference (MUAC) and signs of Oedema was conducted by Sector partners for 194 children. Of the 194 children screened, the MUAC reading for 25 children (18 from inaccessible areas and 7 from accessible areas) was in the Red category, 16 were in the Yellow category and 153 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in any of the 5 LGAs where screening was conducted.

This result also covers four children from neighbouring countries (all screened at Ngala LGA) who were all measured in the Green category.

All children found with severe acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment.

Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
