On 06 and 07 February 2024, a fire broke out in GSSSS camp Monguno, and Mashamari Kuluye camp of Konduga Local Government Area (LGA) of Borno State, which destroyed the shelters and possessions of many Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs). Many personal items have been lost in the fire, including food items and non food items. Three fatalities were reported after the incident.

The fire destroyed 58 self-made/makeshift shelters affecting 391 individuals in 58 households. The affected individuals included 223 children, 88 women and 80 men.

Needs


The victims were in need of shelter and shelter repair kits, other needs included food, MHPSS (mental health and psychosocial support) and NFIs (non food items).

Response

At the time of reporting no assistance has been rendered to the affected population.
