

OVERVIEW

IOM Pakistan collects data on the outflows of Afghan migrants at the Torkham and Chaman border crossing points to better understand the migration movements of Afghan migrants returning to Afghanistan from Pakistan.

Between 16 and 31 August 2023, 3,872 Afghan nationals spontaneously returned to Afghanistan, including 1,340 through the Torkham border point and 2,532 through the Chaman border point. Border authorities facilitated the return of 239 individuals due to the lack of legal documentation to remain in Pakistan. Information about these individuals is not included in the count. Although IOM identified 60,036 Afghan returnees (between 1 January - 31 August 2023) at two border crossings, this may not reflect the total number of Afghan returnees.


Moreover, for this study, only the head of household or representative of the family were interviewed. This means that the number of interviews conducted by the enumerators is lower than the number of returnees recorded by IOM. Between 16 and 31 August 2023, IOM interviewed 220 respondents.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Cross-border mobility between Pakistan and Afghanistan is characterized predominantly by populations speaking Pashto and Baloch languages who reside on both sides of the border.
- The worsening economic conditions in Pakistan is leading to higher levels of unemployment, rents and lower income levels. These, in turn, are increasingly compelling Afghans to return to Afghanistan where they believe they can access higher levels of humanitarian assistance.
- The top three challenges Afghan returnees anticipate facing in Afghanistan include: (i) finding income-generating opportunities, (ii) adapting to life in areas of return, and (iii) securing livelihoods.
- Throughout the reporting period, approximately six percent of returnees were classified as vulnerable individuals.¹
- The primary occupations reported by returnees are: unskilled labour (67%), skilled labour (25%), and involvement in various businesses (8%).
- The average cost of travel from Pakistan to Afghanistan, as reported, stood at PKR 56,477 (equivalent to USD 184 as of September 6, 2023) per family.


DISTRIBUTION OF RETURNEES BETWEEN 16 TO 31 AUGUST








SETTLEMENT TYPE LEGEND



DISTRICTS OF ORIGIN IN PAKISTAN OF RETURNEES



ORIGIN DISTRICT



PROVINCES OF INTENDED DESTINATION


