


# EMERGENCY TRACKING TOOL (ETT)


DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and provide up-to-date information on sudden displacement and other population movements

### Movements




### New Arrival Screening by Nutrition Partners




Within the period of 3-9 October 2018, a total of 2,431 movements were recorded, including 1,988 arrivals and 443 departures. These movements occurred at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Chibok, Damboa, Dikwa, Gubio, Gwoza, Hawul, Kala/Balge, Konduga, Kukawa, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno state, and locations in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Mayo-Belwa, Michika, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Numan, Song, Yola-North and Yola-South LGAs of Adamawa state.

Assessments identified the following main triggers of movements: poor living conditions (28%), voluntary relocation (24%), ongoing conflict (18%), fear of attacks (14%), improved security (14%), farming activities (1%) and military operations (1%).


### Number of individuals by movement triggers

### Summary of major movements

**GWOZA:** 407 arrivals and 18 departures were recorded at Gwoza LGA of Borno state. These include 343 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka from Bama (208 individuals) and Kirawa ward of Gwoza (59 individuals), 57 arrivals at GSS Camp from Dure/Hambagda ward of Gwoza, 7 arrivals at Bulabulin community from Maisandari ward of Maiduguri and 18 departures from Gwoza for Mubi South LGA of Adamawa state. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions, ongoing conflict and military operations.

**BAMA:** 306 arrivals and 23 departures were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno state. These include 253 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from surrounding wards of Bama (239 individuals) and Maiduguri (14 individuals), 53 arrivals at Banki Camp from Kumshe ward of Bama and 23 individuals who left Banki Camp for Ajiri Tuffa ward of Bama. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions and voluntary relocation.

**NUMAN:** 176 arrivals and 76 departures were recorded in Numan LGA of Adamawa state. These include 165 arrivals at Numan II ward from Gamadio ward of Numan due to fear of attacks, 11 arrivals at Imburu ward from Sabon Pegi ward of Numan and 76 individuals who left Numan II ward for Bolki ward of Numan due to fear of attacks.

**KONDUGA:** 138 arrivals were recorded at Auno/Chabbol ward of Konduga LGA in Borno state. These include 135 arrivals at Tungushe community from nearby Balmeri village and 3 arrivals from Baga in Kukawa LGA. The movements were due to recent conflict in the area.

**ASKIRA/UBA:** 112 arrivals and 24 departures were recorded at Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state. These include 49 arrivals from Borno state, 46 arrivals from Madagali LGA, 13 arrivals from Song LGA, 4 arrivals from Plateau state and 24 departures from Husara ward for Gwoza LGA. The main movement triggers include voluntary relocation, improved security and poor living conditions.

## New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid upper arm circumference (MUAC) and signs of Oedema was conducted by Sector partners for 217 children. Of the 217 children screened, the MUAC reading for 23 children (19 from inaccessible and 4 from accessible area) was in the Red category, 35 were in the Yellow category and 159 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in any of the 5 LGAs where screening was conducted.

This result also covers 8 children from neighbouring countries (3 screened at Bama, 4 at Mobbar and 1 at Ngala LGA); of which 6 were in the Green category and 2 in the Yellow category.

All children found with severe acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment.
