




METHODOLOGY

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a sub-component of the mobility tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilizes direct observations and a broad network of key informants to capture the best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.

LIMITATIONS

The ETT figures reported are not cumulative of all the affected persons thus far but rather provide a snapshot of the current displacement situation on the date indicated. The data and information reported on this dashboard are related solely to the movements caused by the triggers on page two between 11 – 17 March.


DISPLACEMENT EVOLUTION

ALERT SUMMARY


Between 11 and 17 March 2024, a total of 1,409 new arrivals were recorded at locations in Adamawa and Borno states. The new arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Damboa, Dikwa, Gwoza, Hawul and Monguno Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected Borno State, in Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Guyuk, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: family reunification (435 individuals or 31%), military operation (291 individuals or 20%), poor living condition (266 individuals or 19%), seasonal farming (173 individuals or 12%), improved security (136 individuals or 10%), fear of attack (98 individuals or 7%) and access to humanitarian support (10 individuals or 1%).




PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS BY MOVEMENT TRIGGER





MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY OF THE NEW ARRIVALS (CHILDREN 6 – 59 MONTHS)

Between 11 and 17 March 2024, an exhaustive nutrition screening using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 163 children of 6-59 months. Of the 163 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that nine were recorded in the red category, 19 in the yellow category and 135 in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the five LGAs assessed.

Among the 163 children screened, 42 arrived from neighbouring countries (2 in Gwoza and 40 in Mobbar); of all the 42 children measured; 38 were in green, four were in yellow and none in the red category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted to the treatment programme.
